






REFLECT

Do you ever wonder why things never seem to come together? We see glimpses of consistency, equity, justice, peace, harmony, and wellbeing, but it always falls short. Human life is still expendable and manipulated, people are used for personal advancement, countries are at war, the economy continues to face turbulence, anger and frustration are widespread, and happiness is the possession of just a few and not the many. Could it be that we are serving the wrong kingdom? We keep trying to make our kingdom work and find ourselves still scratching our heads after repeatedly failed attempts to do so. It is almost as if people are saying, "we'll get it right this time if we do . . .," as if some new and secret innovation has yet to be tried.

We serve God's kingdom. We may not like hearing that, but it is true. God did not make only a few of us. God made all of humanity and all of humanity is called into service. How often do we defer any of our decision making to God? Secular leaders enjoy winking at the Sacred Scriptures and using them when they advance a cause, but are they really listened to? Even those who consider themselves believers tend to sift through God's Word, taking what seems to fit and apply and discarding the rest. After all, if we were really serving God's kingdom, we would see an abundance of fruit testifying to this fact. But what's growing on the vine is anything other than good Gospel-centered fruit.

Nothing in this world or the next belongs to us. We have such a hard time believing this and live our lives as if everything belongs to us. And, the fruit does not lie. Trees that are neglected and not properly fertilized reveal that fact. They cannot keep these deep secrets from being discovered. If God's kingdom was really being served, then life would have looked much differently after the crucifixion. By now, there would be plenty of fantastic fruit to harvest in abundance: faith, hope, love, prudence, temperance, justice, and fortitude. Do we see these in abundance around us? Why not?

Still we grapple with ownership, privilege, status, and the protection of our rights. It's all about us and what we want, think we need, and expect to acquire. When did this change of focus occur? We may be struggling with this since humanity's day in the garden and have never understood that the focus cannot be on us and the apple but on God and God's justice. Maybe the only answer is that the Kingdom be taken from us and given to someone who is willing to do a better job. Is that the fate we really want?


- **Grade K-8** will be homeschooled using the Loyola Press textbook, with catechist involvement and parish support. Monthly K-8 Parent Meetings will be required for only a half-hour on a Thursday evening at Holy Family Church to pick up materials and lesson plans for the coming four weeks of lessons.
- **Grade 2** will only meet at St. Bernard Church the first Saturday of each month for sacramental preparation with their classroom teacher, as well as continued homeschool lessons with parents.
- **Grade 9** will be meeting in person at St. Bernard Church on Sunday evenings starting in October 2020. A parent meeting will be **Tuesday, October 6th at 7 pm at St. Bernard Church.**
- **Grade 10** will follow the schedule that was mailed home to the incoming Confirmation Class of 2020. ***The Sacrament of Confirmation is Saturday, October 17th.***

****Please note if you choose not to homeschool your students this current academic year, it will affect your student's grade placement in their next upcoming year in the Religious Education Program.**


The Archdiocese of Hartford Traveling Rosary Congress will be held October 3-9, 2020.

What is a Traveling Rosary Congress? Seven days of around-the-clock Eucharistic Adoration and Hourly Rosary in response to Our Lady of Fatima’s call to conversion, consecration and prayer, with each 24-hour period hosted at a different parish in the archdiocese. It is offered in a spirit of reparation to restore the sanctity of life, to establish peace in our cities, nation, and world, and to console the hearts of Jesus and Mary.

St. Martha Parish at 214 Brainard Road in Enfield will host the Traveling Rosary Congress with an **Opening Mass at 6 pm on Monday, October 5th**, followed by Eucharistic Adoration and end with a **Closing Mass at 6 pm on Tuesday, October 6th**. During this period Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will take place in the church, with the Rosary and the Chaplet of Divine Mercy prayed aloud at the beginning of each hour followed by silent prayer for the remainder of the hour.

UPDATED INFORMATION

WEEKEND MASSES IN THE ARCHDIOCESE OF HARTFORD

Parishes are open for the public celebration of **weekend** Masses, provided that no more than a total of 200 socially distanced persons are present at a given Mass in keeping with the updated limitation set by the State of Connecticut, which goes into effect on October 8th. All previously set requirements will still be observed during both weekday and weekend Masses. This includes the wearing of masks while in church and the limitation on singing, which may be done by a cantor but will not include participation by the congregation.

Due to this updated information, it is no longer necessary to register to attend Mass. We thank all those who assisted us to stay in compliance with the previous guidelines by calling to register each week.

The **dispensation from the Sunday obligation** granted to all Catholics of the Archdiocese of Hartford by Archbishop Leonard P. Blair extends through **Saturday, November 28th**. The elderly, the sick, those who care for someone who is vulnerable, or those who are fearful or anxious are encouraged not to attend or feel obligated to attend at this time.

Live-streamed Masses, both daily and weekend, will continue on our website (sjsenfield.org) so that those who cannot attend will be able to participate and remain connected with the parish.

If you decide to attend Mass, please be charitable by protecting others and yourself. Please read and follow the guidelines below.

- **If you or someone in your household is ill, especially with fever or flu-like symptoms or conjunctivitis, please do not enter the church.**
- **At all times, including entering and exiting the church, practice social distancing by staying at least 6 feet from people who do not live in your household.**
- **You must wear a face mask or cloth face covering. The proper way to wear the mask effectively is to have the mask cover both your nose and mouth.**
- **Do not shake hands with others.**
- **Use hand sanitizers.**
- **Do not congregate to socialize before or after Mass.**

PLEASE TAKE PRECAUTIONS TO STAY SAFE AND HEALTHY.






