


REFLECT

You are at the eye doctor and it's time for the peripheral vision test. You know the one. It's where you put your head up to a contraption and have to click a switch every time you see a squiggly line. If you don't concentrate and maintain optimal focus, you will miss them and skew the outcome of the test. You can easily find yourself with a diagnosis that really isn't accurate! Concentration and focus are key to succeeding with this evaluation. They are also key to developing a healthy, vibrant spiritual life. If we do not bring our full consciousness to the task, concentrate with all our might, be watchful and vigilant, we are not going to see God's loving presence flashing before our eyes!

That's why we need Advent. Let's face it. We can easily get distracted, focus on nonessential and superficial things and lose touch with what really matters. Our attentions wander. We daydream and even become a bit overwhelmed and tired. All of the stresses and demands of life consume us and we find ourselves constantly trying to play catch up rather than relishing the moment of the now. "Now" moments are so fleeting. They flash before us like those squiggly lines on a screen. Present moments go as quickly as they come but it is important to discover them and rest in them as often as we can. Though gone in a flash, these now moments of encounter with God teach powerful lessons and offer a grounding in truth that can be found nowhere else. It's the grace of Advent to become watchful and attentive because we are never sure when God will surprise us.

God loves surprises and love thrives on them! God's now moments of surprises come as tender instants of intimate connection where I find profound peace, experience joy, and rest in love. These are Advent times reflective of the now moments when Christ first was born, when God surprises us during every time we care to watch and when the great surprise of Christ's second coming dawns upon us all. But, to discover the grandeur and experience the awe of these now times, we have to be ready. We have to want to be there. We have to believe. And, we have to have the desire to soak in as much as we can in the time we have before us.

YES, WE ARE STILL COMMITTED TO HELPING THE HOMELESS HERE IN ENFIELD!!!

The Enfield Safe Harbor Warming Center will be operating two or three nights per week, from 6 pm to 9 pm, during the winter months of January 3, 2021 - March 27, 2021 as an Outreach and Engagement Center to assist our homeless in Enfield during this Covid-19 pandemic.

ESHWC received permission from the Archdiocese of Hartford to use St. Raymond of Penafort Parish - St. Patrick Church at 64 High Street in Enfield as the Engagement facility, where Enfield homeless guests can enter the building to obtain snacks, socks, winter clothing, and possibly Magic Carpet tokens to connect them with agencies for their shelter needs.

We will be following all safety protocols to ensure that our volunteers and guests will be safe.

We are in of need volunteers to assist us with the setup, cleaning, tearing down and sanitizing, as well as help with the flow of traffic and the number of people entering and exiting, assuring they follow safety protocols, helping to distribute the winter goods and snack items, and directing guests to exit through a separate area from the entrance.

Volunteers will be trained in all safety and health protocols, and training is scheduled at St. Patrick's Church at 6:30 pm on Tuesday, December 15, 2020.

DONATIONS NEEDED





WEEKEND MASSES IN THE ARCHDIOCESE OF HARTFORD

Parishes are open for the public celebration of **weekend** Masses, provided that no more than a total of <u>100</u> socially distanced persons are present at a given Mass in keeping with the updated limitation set by the State of Connecticut, which went into effect on November 6th. All previously set requirements will still be observed during both weekday and weekend Masses. This includes the wearing of masks while in church and the limitation on singing, which may be done by a cantor but will not include participation by the congregation.

The dispensation from the Sunday obligation granted to all Catholics of the Archdiocese of Hartford by Archbishop Leonard P. Blair extends through <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>February 16</u>, <u>2021</u>. The elderly, the sick, those who care for someone who is vulnerable, or those who are fearful or anxious are encouraged not to attend or feel obligated to attend at this time.

Live-streamed Masses, both daily and weekend, will continue on our website (sjjenfield.org) so that those who cannot attend will be able to participate and remain connected with the parish.

If you decide to attend Mass, please be charitable by protecting others and yourself. Please read and follow the guidelines below.

- If you or someone in your household is ill, especially with fever or flu-like symptoms or conjunctivitis, please do not enter the church.
- At all times, including entering and exiting the church, practice social distancing by staying at least 6 feet from people who do not live in your household.
- You must wear a face mask or cloth face covering. The proper way to wear the mask effectively is to have the mask cover both your nose and mouth.
- Do not shake hands with others.
- Use hand sanitizers.
- Do not congregate to socialize before or after Mass.

We begin another Church year this weekend with the start of Advent. This is a time we prepare for the Lord's coming into our lives now, his return in glory, and celebrating his birth in Nazareth in history. These four weeks before Christmas are a time for prayer, reflection, and penance in celebrating the Lord's birth. We continue to follow the Lord's way by our generosity and charity.

Christmas will be celebrated differently this year in our parish. Archbishop Blair has extended the dispensation from the obligation to participate at Mass until February 16, 2021. This dispensation is given because of the concerns of many about their health and wellbeing.

The parish will celebrate Masses for Christmas but those who want to attend need to register by calling the rectory by <u>Thursday</u>, <u>December 17th</u> to obtain tickets for Mass.

This will allow us to observe the guideline of no more than 100 persons as part of the 2.1 guidelines of the state. I ask your cooperation during this time. I pray that all can enjoy a safe and healthy holiday.


