










## REFLECT

It's all so ordinary that we can easily miss it. The seagulls hunting and diving for mollusks at the beach offer a display of determination and precision as they gather their food for the day. It's simply what these creatures do. Yet, there's a magical artfulness and skill to their work that speaks volumes about the One who breathed life into their being. This is pretty much the way it is with God's presence. God comes in common ways through common things and ordinary people. Sadly, we are so engulfed in our little worlds of order and ideas to notice the beauty and wonder of it all. Many have numbed themselves to the Divine spark at the essence of all life because that's just the way it is. What's so special about it? A sunset is a sunset and a seagull is a seagull. That's precisely what they thought about Jesus too. After all, isn't he just the carpenter's son? What merit can his words possibly have?

If we're looking for God to come in an event that is so dramatic and intense that it knocks our socks off, then think again. When pondering God's relationship with His people and God's action in our lives, we have to go back to the stable and the recurring, creative, unending power of God's presence. It was a quiet, run of the mill kind of night. There was nothing spectacular or extraordinary. To the naked eye, a woman gave birth to a child and there wasn't anything extraordinary to see. We have a hard time understanding God's ordinary-ness. Jesus grew up in an ordinary town, had neighbors and did normal human things. Perhaps that's why we don't always like the Gospel. It doesn't dazzle us with extraordinary things but simply challenges us to take a different look at our ordinary stuff. That makes us uncomfortable. We prefer things as they are. Our lack of faith can even cause us to take offense at what Jesus says and does, dismissing it as folly.

God's life-giving presence continues to sustain that seagull in flight and keep all things in being regardless of whether we have the faith to see and understand this. Our personal agendas, preconceived ideas, misconceptions, and expectations can often cause us to be hardened and blinded to what God is doing or desiring to do. While God continues to do what He has done for all eternity, faith is needed for God's presence to bear fruit. The blinders we wear and the expectations we bring to life can often prevent us from seeing graced moments that radiate with God's graceful presence. They also prevent God's transforming, healing, and hope filled vision for our world from being realized. Without faith, God won't be able to do much for us either.

## FROM FATHER GOLAS

Archbishop Blair has announced the time for the closing Mass of Synod 2020. The pandemic delayed by over a year this special event. The closing Mass will be celebrated at the Oakdale Theatre in Wallingford on **Friday, August 13th** at 6:30 pm. As a parish, we have been asked to send a delegation of 28 with our two Synod delegates Karen and Kevin McGuane. This is the third synod of the Archdiocese and the closing should be a memorable occasion. I have ordered a bus for our trip which will leave from Holy Family Church parking lot at 4:15 pm. A box lunch will be provided.

For your understanding, a synod is an assembly of various groups representing the faithful of the diocese. Archbishop Blair has convened the Synod 2020 with the theme "Go and Grow". The focus of the synod has been the need for evangelization, which is a vigorous proclamation of the Gospel to draw others to Christ and the Church. Pope Francis has taught that all who are baptized in Christ are missionary disciples who "take our personal encounter with Jesus Christ to others". "Go and Grow 2020" is an important moment for the Church of the Archdiocese of Hartford to renew and revitalize the way we live out our faith at this time. We pray for the Holy Spirit's inspiration for the Synod, the Archdiocese of Hartford and our St. Jeanne Jugan Parish.

# HOW TO REPORT AN INCIDENT OF SEXUAL ABUSE TO THE ARCHDIOCESE OF HARTFORD

If you have knowledge or suspect that a minor or vulnerable adult (an adult with an intellectual disability) has been sexually abused, in any manner, by personnel of the Archdiocese of Hartford, you are urged to report this information to:

In addition, you will be asked to follow up in writing with a detailed description of the facts involved in the incident. Specifics of this written report can be found in the <u>Policies and Procedures of the Archdiocese of Hartford Relating to Allegations of Sexual Misconduct Involving Minors and Vulnerable Adults</u>. This document is also available online at <u>www.archdioceseofhartford.org</u>. The Archdiocese of Hartford will report any and all incidents to the proper civil authorities.

Mandated reporters in the State of Connecticut are required by law to report any incident of sexual abuse involving a minor or vulnerable adult. We encourage any Non-Mandated persons to report such incidents to the proper authorities as well. We support your right to do so.

Incidents involving sexual abuse of minors (persons under the age of 18) should be reported to:



Once a written report of an incident of sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult has been received, an investigation will be undertaken by, or on behalf of, the Archdiocese of Hartford.



## PARISH UPDATES FROM FATHER GOLAS

The pandemic has certainly changed so many aspects of life. Our parish has managed to continue to gather for Mass and other sacraments even with the safety guidelines and space and seating restrictions. The guidelines have been substantially reduced recently and it seems we are returning to more ordinary ways of functioning. The past year has led to many new and different practices that seem to be useful and beneficial. We have been using collection boxes instead of taking up a collection during Mass at both churches. This practice helps to keep the Mass flowing without delay. The parish has ordered additional boxes to be placed at the main entrances of the two churches. The collection boxes will continue to be used from this time forward. The ushers will continue to welcome people and assist them at Mass at Holy Family Church and St. Bernard Church.

For the Sacrament of Reconciliation at Holy Family Church, the parish will be renovating the room off the vestibule (formerly the cry room) as the new place for this sacrament. It is more spacious with windows along one side to provide light. I have found this to be a better place for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. A vesting sacristy will be installed for when we return to beginning Mass with an entrance procession from the vestibule, which I hope will be soon. At St. Bernard Church, the Sacrament of Reconciliation will continue to be celebrated in the chapel for now, which is adjacent to the Sanctuary in the former Cheverus Hall. When conditions improve, the sacrament will be celebrated in the Reconciliation room on the rectory side of the church.

At St. Bernard Church, daily Mass will continue to be celebrated in the main church. With the limited space in the chapel, I don't think it is wise to continue to use it for Mass. Instead, the room will used for a meeting space after some renovation. There are Religious Education classes that meet at St. Bernard and additional space will be helpful. These necessary changes brought about by the pandemic have turned out to be helpful and useful. I will communicate as I have in the past when changes will occur.

I appreciate your prayers and understanding.

**Reminder:** Given Governor Lamont's declaration that remaining restrictions be lifted, on May 19th our churches reopened to 100% capacity with no need for any specific social distancing. As of June 9th, Archbishop Blair modified the safety practices regarding COVID-19, stating that **masks will still be required for those who are unvaccinated while in church and optional for those who are fully vaccinated**. Please also be aware that the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass in person on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation is no longer in force as of May 22, 2021.

## FROM FATHER GOLAS

I am very pleased to announce that Pat Keck, our parish Coordinator of Religious Education has completed the ELM Leadership Formation Program of the Office of Education, Evangelization, and Catechesis as of June 17, 2021. This program is an 18 month process of human, spiritual, intellectual and pastoral formation for those serving in parish ministry. Each participant was required to take six courses from the University of Notre Dame's step program as well courses in the OEEC's office in Bloomfield, to have a mentor to assist in the reflection and growth in theological understanding, formation days for prayer and reflection, and provide written reflections on the work completed. Kelly Henderschedt, the Archdiocesan Director of Faith Formation commended Pat highly in her commitment to the program and her personal faith development.

It is my honor and privilege to announce that Pat will now have the position of Director of Religious Education (DRE) for the parish. I highly value Pat's work on behalf of faith formation for all of our parishioners. We are blessed as a parish by her faith commitment and dedication to serving.


