Living Water bottles will be sent home tomorrow for one of our Lenten giving projects.

This Lent we have two opportunities for almsgiving. First, we will participate in the Archdiocesan Living Water Project. Students and families put change into the water bottles and return it to the school on or before March 7th. Money collected will help provide clean water to our sister diocese in Kitui, Kenya.

Our second Lenten almsgiving project will be the annual Food Drive. Food and donations, five items or \$5, are collected to benefit Hastings Family Services. More information on the food drive will be in future eNews emails.

Tomorrow, our 8th graders will head to Sharing and Caring Hands in Minneapolis to help feed the needy. They prepare the meal, serve it, and handle the clean up. They will also take a tour of the Basilica of St. Mary.
