Traveling Mary


Please, consider assisting with this very important ministry of praying for vocations!

Congratulations on your upcoming marriage. Please contact the parish office to begin the preparation at least six months in advance.



MONTHLY PRAYER INTENTIONS OF POPE FRANCIS February: For vocations to the priesthood and religious life

Let us pray that the ecclesial community might welcome the desires and doubts of those young people who feel a call to serve Christ's mission in the priesthood and religious life.

Pastor's Message

This weekend we get a special liturgical treat where the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord falls on a Sunday. For many years in Church history this was the proper end to the Christmas season, and it is a magnificent pleasure to celebrate this feast this weekend. The history of the feast deals with Mosaic law where forty days after the birth of Christ Mary redeemed her first-born from the temple as written in Numbers, and was purified by the prayer of Simeon the just, in the presence of Anna the prophetess. So, the first solemn introduction of Christ into the house of God, was in the earliest times celebrated in the Church of Jerusalem. There are records of this feast dating to the first half of the fourth century. The day was solemnly kept by a procession to the Constantinian basilica of the Resurrection, but the feast then had no proper name; it was simply called the fortieth day after Epiphany.

Now, the Readings for this Feast Day focus on the theme of the priesthood of Christ, seeing a type of priestly significance to this first entrance of the Messiah into the Temple. These Readings ask us to reflect firstly on how Jesus has served and continues to serve as our great High Priest, and also how his priesthood is lived out in our own lives, since we share in his priesthood by virtue of our Baptism. This can challenge us to reflect on the sacrifices we get to offer up each day as we serve the Lord in our schools, jobs, volunteering, and in our relationships with our friends and families. And as we go to Mass on Sunday or daily, we can place these offerings on the altar as well as we in turn receive the graces of Jesus' sacrifice in the Holy Eucharist. So, let us do our best to always present ourselves as priests, prophets, and kings as we share the joy of the Gospel every day.
