### **Full of Surprises**

I've seen more wildlife in my rectory these past 16 months than in any place I've lived before. Last year I had a snake come to spend the night as well as waves of mice after the adjacent cane field was harvested. I also remember an invasion of Asian lady beetles in multiple church buildings last fall. This year I'm surprised that different animals have come to visit. I haven't seen an indoor snake or mouse this season, but I have seen enough frogs that I feel sorry for those who endured the biblical plague. After all the summer rain we had, frogs were frequent guests. They swarmed the rectory garage door at night. They climbed the entrance doors and jumped inside the house when the door was opened. They frequented the living room and the kitchen in the rectory. As unsettling as it was to find a frog in a cup, I would much prefer that to finding one in bed.

One lesson for me is that life is full of surprises. After last year, I was anticipating what I would do with the next house snake, and I was ready for the seasonal field mice with the best in mouse accommodations. (I'll call it "Hotel Victor.") The cane harvest came and went, and now I have a frogs, not mice. As much as it would make things simpler if every day or change in seasons was predictable, I think I prefer the adventure of new encounters. This makes me wonder, what critter will be the next guest?

I had another surprise when I recently visited a brother priest at his parish. His was one of the many parishes impacted by the August Flood of 2016, so there was an expectation that this would be a tough assignment for a new pastor. What surprised me was there was so much life and energy in the parish. Mass attendance had increased noticeably since his arrival, so much so that he's already planning to expand seating in the church. There is already a cleared plot of earth where the new rectory will be built, the old one still gutted after the flood. Based on the energy and activity, I could hardly believe this pastor started this past July! His energy and zeal give me hope despite my slow going in the cluster.

This last surprise was inspired by Fr. Brad's Trivia Nights. I recently read a book written by a pope of the last 60 years about the Holy Spirit. Can you guess which pope wrote these words? He said, "The pastors are not just persons who hold a certain office. They themselves are charismatics; they are responsible for keeping the Church open to the action of the Holy Spirit." You might be surprised that Pope Benedict XVI wrote that in his book, New Outpourings of the Spirit. Please pray that your pastor receives an outpouring, not of frogs and mice in his home, but of the Holy Spirit!



### Treasures From our Tradition

Earlier this autumn, we looked at how our Eucharistic Prayers have been enriched by the approval of several new prayers to augment the old Roman Canon. For us, there are the four standard prayers, three for Masses with Children, and the most recent addition, the former Swiss Eucharistic Prayer with four alternative forms (now known as the **Eucharistic Prayer** for Masses for Various Needs and Occasions). We also have two **Eucharistic Prayers** for Masses of Reconciliation. The source for these two prayers is the request by many bishops for a special prayer for the "Holy Year" of 1975. Originally, the committee in charge was commissioned to write a single

prayer, but the theme proved so rich that it gave rise to two. The first is based on and develops biblical texts on reconciliation. The second starts with the experience of living in today's fractured world, and how the Spirit calls us to reconciliation and peace. Not everyone was



happy with all this creativity, saying that if too many were published, it would be difficult for the Vatican to control further requests. Everyone thought the pope would put strict limits on the prayers, but in the end he said he was willing to open doors that had long been closed.

Although he approved them for a period of only three years, they were never formally removed from the Sacramentary and have been incorporated into the new Roman Missal.
