

Even when we falter or sink, simply crying "Lord, save me!" is enough to help us know the steady grasp of God's hand. The Sound of School

(Mark 12:30)

For example, if you only read this bulletin article every week for the past year, you would have read the equivalent of a small book. There are other ways to learn besides reading. As I've mentioned before, I like listening to Catholic talks while I'm driving. It's a blessed way to pass the time!


