



LENT AND EASTER GUIDELINES

THE LENTEN SEASON A distinction is to be made between Lent and the Easter Triduum. Strictly speaking, Lent ends with the beginning of the Triduum on Holy Thursday. The Ordo notes: "Lent runs from Ash Wednesday until the Mass of the Lord's Supper exclusive on Holy Thursday."

FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound to fast may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted, if necessary, to maintain strength according to each one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years or older on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and on all Fridays of Lent. The determination of certain days as obligatory days of penance should not be understood as limiting the occasions for Christian penance.

Friendship

In the second reading last week St. Paul speaks of his humility and tells us that he is grateful to the Lord for the mission he was given. All of the things he spoke about were from the gospel that Christ gave him, and he would continue his part to bring the love of God to the Corinthians. Paul spent about 16 months collaborating with them and most of it was in difficult times. The people of Corinth were both Jewish and Greek whose understanding of religion was quite different than the gospel that he was preaching. Even with those obstacles he was successful.

In the second reading today, St. Paul assures his followers and converts that the most important part to conversion was to make God the essential part of their daily life. The Jews and the Greeks had many more stringent rules. St. Paul stressed that the most important part of their lives was to live as Christ did and to do everything with love, kindness, and forgiveness. This must have been difficult for them because it was different from the beliefs they were accustomed to. Today we see people who have a problem living the way of our religion because they are more interested in living their own way rather than the way of God. As we go through our lives we have many different relationships with family, friends, with those who work with us, or work for us, those who deliver our mail and those who we meet at the grocery store. Of all of these, which relationships should be the strongest?


