



Friendship

The writer of the letter to the Hebrews was unknown. The author was focused on the Hebrews whereas St. Paul in his writing was the Apostle of the Gentiles. The second reading today looked at the difference between the Greek and Hebrew understanding of their cultures. The Greeks were followers of Plato's teachings, and the Hebrews followed the commandments given to Moses. Today's reading is based on the contrast between the Old Testament and the New Testament introduced by Jesus.

In the Old Testament the Jews only had access to God if they kept the commandments. If they sinned and broke one of the 613 rules they would have to bring to the High Priest an animal as a sacrifice.

Jesus came to be the perfect sacrifice. His death on the cross was the opening access to God. His suffering opened the New Testament.

In understanding this reading, we must keep three things in mind. (1) The action of Jesus brought us access to God. (2) The world can be sometimes unkind and dark but the connection that Jesus gave us with God will bring light into our life (3) Our lives will have suffering, just as Jesus had a suffering. These challenges will strengthen us and allow us a closer relationship with God.

God calls us to holiness and everything that happens in our lives gives us a chance to grow in holiness.
