



St. Paul is speaking to the Ephesians in the second reading today and we will follow his letters to them all the way through August. Paul had explained to the Ephesians the gifts that Jesus gave to them by his death and resurrection. He now explains their part in becoming part of this society. Paul also mentions that there is an obligation to Christian virtues to those who chose to follow because their participation can help or hinder the status of the whole society.
