

Arrogance or Forgiveness

When I was young, much like many other teenagers of that time, I believed that I had figured out the world and made decisions that proved to be not the correct course for the rest of my life. I wanted freedom, independence and control.

In Luke's Gospel today we find another young man who wanted the same things, although the way he chose was unheard of in his culture and in his time. It was an extremely hurtful path he had chosen, especially for his father. For a son to ask his father for the things he would inherit was like wishing his father would die. Also, the reaction to such a request in that time, would probably have precipitated the death of the son. It was within the father's power not to honor the wishes of the son. But even if he forced him to stay, he could not force him to accept his love or return it. Now without pointing a finger at anyone, let us take a look at the younger son's journey. Most if not all of us at one time or another have ventured off to find something we did not believe we had at home. It could be a life of independence that we wanted to build for ourselves. Or it could have been to search for the respect that we did not feel in our home environment. Or it could have been something as simple as a desire to find love. Unfortunately, all of our journeys have not_been successful and sometimes our successful journeys have been unfortunate.

Even if you haven't taken a journey like this, one you might know someone who has and maybe, just maybe, you have dreamed of a life apart from the one you were guided into. Under closer examination the younger son at one time has probably lived in each of us.

One of the other characters in the parable, the older son, does not appear to be that complex of an individual. He obviously was not a traveler and was well grounded in his father's ways.

Sometimes people who are focused on duty can lack understanding towards someone who does not have the same focus. For those of us who have that amount of commitment, the older son might seem to be the real center of the story. But he, and possibly all of us, at some time in our lives fail to realize how difficult it is to be undisciplined in a disciplined environment.

Whatever side you fall on, in this example the other side seems different. When a task in our life is easy for us, we can lose sight of how difficult it can be for others and become a bit 'self-righteous. Here in lies the difference between the opinion the father and the older son had of the younger son. The father saw the younger son as lost. The older son saw him as flawed.

Now to the character in the parable that seems to be the reflection of Our Almighty Father. Throughout this parable he departed from the traditional role of an elderly Jewish patriarch.

It would have been very unlikely that he would have liquidated 40% of his assets to give to the younger son so he could leave, but he did. The amount of hurt and humiliation he endured at his son's request should have made him resentful, but it didn't. It was also unheard of for an elderly Jewish man to run for any reason, much less to greet a son that had hurt him so deeply, but he did. Even after all that the son had put him through, he greeted him with open arms, accepted him back before the younger son even had time to apologize, and ordered a celebration.

What better example do we have of the love and forgiveness of God the Father than the father in the story that Jesus told? And not only the love for the older son who did whatever the father wanted, but also the love for the younger son who did whatever he wanted.

I began by telling you a story about a journey which started in my life and followed by a story that Jesus talked about the journey a young man took in his life. But was it really about a journey taken in life or a journey taken through life? We all grow and try to find our own way in life. Then at some time we may become

a little set in our own ways and try to tell others how they should do things. But I hope we all arrive to a point in our lives where we can become the "Prodigal Father" who realizes that everyone needs to find their own way in life and has the gift of free will to pursue it. Then hopefully after our journey through life, we can do as our Heavenly Father and love and forgive others. The younger son was called prodigal because he was reckless with his wealth and gave it away wastefully. I call the father 'prodigal' because he also gave away his wealth, his love, and his forgiveness. He did it lavishly with abundance, and unconditionally with the understanding that in the end those are the most important things we really have to give.


