When you come to a stop sign you stop and believe other people will also do the same. What you see is the effect of the sign. Both of these things are forms of Faith. Some are true faith and some are simply desires.

Jesus' followers were with Him for 3 years and saw all of His miracles and were a part of His journey to change the way people acted and reacted. When He was crucified some of His followers' true faith was shadowed and turned into hope even after hearing that Mary of Magdalene had seen Jesus.

Faith can be defined as complete trust or confidence in someone or something. Hope is what you think the stop sign will do. Trust can be a difficult thing today when we are in a world that finds material things more important than spiritual belief. We have just ended the period of Lent and began the celebration of the resurrection of our Lord and savior Jesus Christ. Now is the time to put away our desires and grow in our faith. Jesus gave up divinity and assumed humanity to lead us to His eternity.



DIVINE MERCY ABC's

The Divine Mercy message is one we can call to mind simply by remembering ABC:

- A Ask for His Mercy. God wants us to approach Him in prayer constantly, repenting of our sins and asking Him to pour His mercy out upon us and upon the whole world.
- **B** Be merciful. God wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. He wants us to extend love and forgiveness to others just as He does to us.
- **C** Completely trust in Jesus. God wants us to know that the graces of His mercy are dependent upon our trust. The more we trust in Jesus, the more we will receive.

In 1931, our Lord appeared to St. Faustina in a vision. She saw Jesus clothed in a white garment with His right hand raised in blessing. His left hand was touching his garment in the area of the Heart, from where two large rays came forth, one red and the other pale. Jesus said to her: "Paint an image according to the pattern you see, with the signature: Jesus, I Trust In You. I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish."

At the request of her spiritual director, St. Faustina asked the Lord about the meaning of the rays in the image. She heard these words in reply: "The two rays denote Blood and Water. The pale ray stands for the Water which make souls righteous. The red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls. These two rays issued forth from the depths of My tender mercy when My agonized Heart was opened by a lance on the Cross. By means of this image I shall grant many graces to souls. It is to be a reminder of the demands of My mercy because even the strongest faith is of no avail without works."


These words indicate that the Image represents the graces of Divine Mercy poured out upon the world, especially through Baptism and the Eucharist.
