Peace

Peace is a subject much like love, everyone understands it, but it is very difficult to explain. In today's Gospel, John tells us that, at the Last Supper, Jesus is preparing his disciples for what is about to take place. His work is almost complete, and he is preparing to be with his father and leave his disciples to the care of the Holy Spirit. Jesus had taken these ordinary men on a three-year voyage not only geographically but spiritually. On this journey they have witnessed many miracles and physical phenomena but the next experience they are going to witness will test any faith that they might have accrued. That is the point of this narrative, to assure them that they are on the right path that the Holy Spirit will guide them on. I know that there is no one at peace on any of the major television channels, or in any of the movies, or in any major sporting events. All of the above-mentioned people are not at peace. How do I know? Just watch them. The factors of peace are harmony, oneness with the community, and wellness for all. What would the peace of God look like?

It would look like confidence, and calm in the face of disaster. It would look like positive action in an overall negative situation

It would present itself as a symbol of order in a picture of chaos. The peace that Jesus spoke about is knowing that He is the power and He is on your side, the real boss, the one who is in charge of everything; the one who told Job, "Where were you when I founded the earth? Who determined its size?" And the one who told Moses, "Just touch the Red Sea with your staff and it will open up and close behind you." There exist between men and God a living exchange of knowledge and of giving that is love. Jesus gave us peace, and it is up to us to accept it. What Jesus gave us is not fragile.

In our families, at work, and in our businesses, feelings become frayed and attempts to reconcile bring about a frail harmony that can be broken with the speaking of a word or misinterpretation of an action. Jesus' peace is rock solid. His actions were always direct and never weak. His dedication to his father's will gave him peace even at the most difficult times. That is the peace that he gave to us, a solid feeling of security in the face of conflict, and all day, every day, the realization that loving him will give us eternal happiness.

We have all seen people who have totally accepted this belief. They do not stand out in a crowd because of what they do but because of what they don't do. They act rather than react. Nothing seems to upset them, and their presence has a calming effect on their surroundings.

They have the peace that Jesus spoke of. How do we go about getting that mind set? We must accept him as boss and give up our will to his will. Let him take the lead, ask for his input and do his will. This is done in steps. We cannot snap our fingers and do it all at once.

Our mission is to find a time in our lives, which is most like the peace that Jesus gave us. It could be talking to Him, sharing with a family member, helping someone in need, or just looking back over your day knowing that Jesus was present in it. Remember the feeling and then try to do more of what ever gave you that feeling.

Even though those two words, peace and love, are difficult to explain, they are linked because you cannot have peace without love. Also, they are different because love receives its power from giving and peace receives its power from acceptance.


