A handkerchief that belonged to Gerard was applied to the area of her womb and she was able to give birth with no further complications. **A Communal Celebration of the
Anointing of the Sick
Saturday, October 18**

On Saturday October 18, 2025, there will be a Communal Celebration of the Anointing of the Sick at the **8:30am Mass at St Anthony** in honor of **St Luke, Patron Saint of Physicians**. The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is both "a liturgical and a communal celebration." In the family home, hospital, or church, members of the Body of Christ gather for the sacramental rite led by a priest. The Penitential Rite followed by the Liturgy of the Word and sacramental anointing of the sick can inspire and comfort both those who are ill and their family and friends who are gathered. Many parishes have communal celebrations at which many persons receive the sacrament. These sacramental celebrations are a "source of strength amid pain and weakness, hope amid despair" and a "joyful encounter" for the entire community.

There will be a "Living Rosary" on Tuesday October 21 at 5:45pm in the Holy Family Garden at St Joseph Church. Each person will be a "Bead" on the Rosary and will pray the prayer associated with that bead (Our Father, Hail Mary, or Glory Be). Novena and Mass will follow in church. **Please note the change in this year's date and time.**



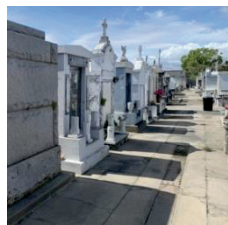
Come join us on Thursday, October 23 for a 6:00 Rosary and 6:30 Mass in honor of the Silver Rose – A Higher Purpose

– Share the message of Our Lady of Guadalupe and promote respect for life by participating in this meaningful pilgrimage. The Silver Rose program demonstrates the unity between Knights of Columbus in Canada, the United States and Mexico, through a series of prayer services promoting the dignity of all human life and honoring Our Lady. Each year, from early March through mid-December, Silver Roses are stewarded by Knights of Columbus councils along routes from Canada to Mexico. Every stop the Silver Rose makes throughout the pilgrimage is a rosary-centered occasion for Knights, parishioners and community members to pray for respect for life, for the spiritual renewal of each nation, and for the advancement of the message of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

The Roman Catholic Church of the Archdiocese of New Orleans ("Archdiocese") and 157 affiliated Catholic organizations including Catholic parishes, schools, organizations, and ministries announced a multi-million dollar proposed settlement to compensate individuals who claim they were sexually abused by clergy or church personnel. All information submitted will be kept confidential.

Action & Love

Today's reading by Luke can be a little difficult to put in perspective. It appears that if you do what is asked of you then your status should change from a servant to a person who receives rewards of the action. Well, this has a very different meaning. When the servant does what he is supposed to do then Jesus' asked the disciples if because of this should the roles change. Should he sit at the table instead of serving the table?

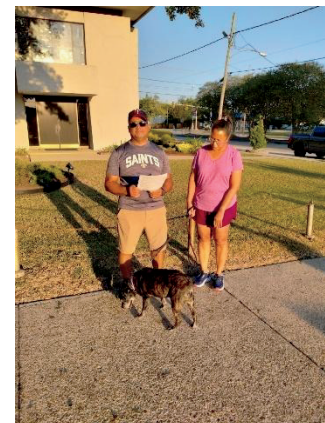
He has called them, and us, to be his disciples and to go forth and spread His word and teach people about the Father and His Father's will for us. His question is, "because we do what He wants does this entitle us to be served by Him?" You see heaven is a gift, God's grace is a gift, and our creation was a gift. All we can do is accept these gifts. God's greatest gift to us is his love and He gives it to us freely. It is up to us to decide if we want to accept this love. If you choose to we will show our love for Him by doing what he asks of us. Think about someone whom you love. When you love someone, you do the best you can for that person. But because you love them, it is not a task, it is a joy. And that joy brings happiness to both of you.

You can't put conditions on your love. For instance, "If I love you, it is your responsibility to keep the house clean and raise the children or I will not love you any longer." Or "if you buy me a big house and make plenty money so I can have anything I want I will love you."

That is not love, that is extortion. But love does have a structure, and in that structure, there are things that we abide by. When you love someone, you stay within that structure. You would never do something to someone you love that would intentionally hurt them or do anything that will bring harm to them. God loves us unconditionally within that structure and our love for him and for one another needs to be the same.

Today as we go about our daily tasks, we can remember that we were created by love for love. When during the day we begin a task think about how unconditional God's love is for us and try to accept it and then reflect that love to the people we encounter.

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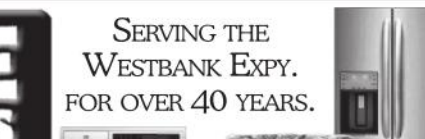
