## A LETTER FROM DEACON DAVID AARON

Greetings my friends at St Angela!

I thought I would use my opportunity to write a letter in the bulletin to reflect on my diaconal ministry. Many of you may recall that I was ordained in December of 2010. There were only 10 of us left after Katrina took away many of those who had initially discerned a vocation to the diaconate. We became known as the class of hope and perseverance. Like most deacons, I have been blessed to be able to baptize children and I have also had the honor of witnessing several marriages. I also have the privilege of serving as a Master of Ceremonies for the Archdiocese. Being an MC, I have traveled from one end of the Archdiocese to the other, literally. I've been to St John the Baptist (both in Paradis and Folsom) and to Annunciation in Bogalusa (twice!).



But, I have to say that the ministry that has made me feel the most humble has been my involvement with the Substance Addiction Ministry. Several years ago, when Fr Beau asked me to lead this ministry, working alongside Lisa Carroll, a registered addiction counselor, I thought: *"How can I do this? I know nothing about addiction."* In fact, it turned out that what little I thought I knew about addiction was totally wrong. I grew up being told that people who had a substance addiction such as alcoholism or an addiction to heroin were simply weak and not trying hard enough.

What we now know about the science of addiction is that it is, in fact, both a spiritual and a physical disease. The mental picture that I had was debunked at the very first meeting we had here. People who are addicted come from all walks of life, and for many, the addiction occurred as the result of pain medication prescribed after some trauma such as a surgery or an accident. People who are addicted do NOT want to have the disease any more than someone with diabetes wants to have that disease. In both cases, it is something they will have to live with for the rest of their lives, but – there is hope in recovery.

And what I have also come to understand is that it's well known that those who are afflicted with addiction are not the only ones who suffer; those who love and care for them are also affected. Those affected by addiction struggle to help their loved ones and often feel helpless in the face of their loved one's addiction.

Through the Substance Addiction Ministry, we provide help and hope through professional referrals, information, and spiritual support. We are here for you. I am grateful to be able to serve here at St Angela. God bless!

When some tribulation or persecution comes because of the word, he immediately falls away. The seed sown among thorns is the one who hears the word, but then worldly anxiety and the lure of riches choke the word and it bears no fruit. But the seed sown on rich soil is the one who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and yields a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold."

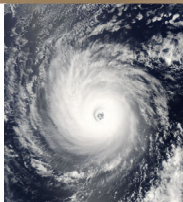

## Saint of the Week

**SAINT KATERI TEKAKWITHA (1656-1680)**

**Feast Day: July 14**

Though the New York State Thruway runs close by the North American Martyrs' Shrine, traffic's roar never pierces the peace enveloping Auriesville—Ossernon to Native Americans—in the lovely Mohawk Valley, where Kateri Tekakwitha was born barely ten years after the martyrdom of Isaac Jogues and his Jesuit and lay companions. Daughter of a Christian Algonquin mother and non-Christian Mohawk chief, Kateri's parents died in a smallpox epidemic widely blamed on the missionaries. Moreover, many Native Americans had experienced exploitation at the hands of "Christian" traders and trappers, further discrediting the faith Kateri embraced in baptism, then pledged to live even more intensely in vowed virginity. Misunderstanding led to harassment, prompting her move to a Christian village farther north along the Saint Lawrence River. Despite this, Kateri's faith remained undaunted, her selfless charity undiminished. Both before and after her death at twenty-four, this young "Lily of the Mohawks" drew countless converts to Christ by the fragrance of her goodness. The Sacrament of Confirmation will now be held on Tuesday, July 14 at 7:00 p.m. at St. Angela Merici Church.

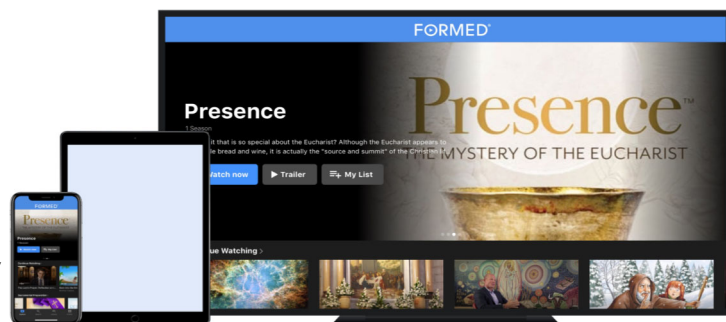

Clients can receive a pre-packed bag of food and some optional supplemental items every two weeks. Clients fill out a simple intake form at their first visit, and at subsequent visits only need provide their name. Please wear a mask and respect social distancing when receiving assistance.

## Catholic Counseling Service

Out of compliance with the precautions regarding COVID-19, Catholic Counseling Service (CCS) continues to offer telehealth services to individuals, couples, and families through the phone or video-conferencing platforms. This new and effective method of counseling allows CCS to extend our services across the archdiocese to areas we weren't previously available. We will resume our face-to-face counseling at our New Orleans office; however, staff and clients are required to take necessary precautions to ensure the safety of all, including wearing facemasks and maintaining 6 feet apart where possible.

Through the generosity of a donor, CCS has received a grant to increase the number of clients we can assist with the cost of counseling, including providing pro bono services when necessary. CCS offers counseling for \$50 a session and will continue to use a sliding scale to assist anyone looking for counseling.
