A LETTER FROM DEACON GILBERT SCHMIDT

Father Beau has asked all of the Deacons to write an article about themselves that will end up in the bulletin. Deacon Nick was first, followed by Deacon Ray and Deacon David. And now, they ran out of people so they scraped the bottom of the barrel and found me. So, here's my story!

I was born to Harry C. Schmidt, Sr. and Anita Barilleaux in 1932 and grew up in the Church Parish of St. Rose of Lima on Bayou Road and Broad Streets. I began serving Mass around the age of 9 and haven't stopped yet. Even during my tour of duty in the U.S. Navy, I had the opportunity to serve Mass for the Chaplains who came to take care of our spiritual needs. After an unsuccessful enrollment at Holy Cross High School, I was sent to St. Stanislaus High School in Bay St. Louis, MS. where, hopefully, my insufficiencies were corrected. (Some still debate this.) Fell in love with the Brothers of the Sacred Heart and was almost ready to head to their Novitiate and then I met my new vocation, Anna Ladner. I forgot all about the life in ministry and began a life of parenthood to 9 children. I can assure you, they were much more of a challenge than any ministry the Church has to offer.



However, when our Church brought back the Ministry of Permanent Diaconate I, again, became interested in serving people and when Deacon Ray Heap was ordained, I saw what beauty the work of God could be when offered and accepted, so I talked to my Pastor, then Father John Favalora, and he advised me that the class entrance was closed until the next class, if there would even be one. So, again, I forgot about it, but began attending morning Mass and serving as a Lector and was appointed one of the first Extra Ordinary Ministers of the Holy Eucharist in our Parish. That satisfied my thirst for a while until the next call came out 4 years later. I applied and was accepted and studied for 3 ½ years, rather than the two years prior to this, and was ordained by Archbishop Hannan at the Cathedral of St. Louis King of France on December 13, 1980. I was then "missioned" to St. Angela Merici Parish. And then the fun began!

All of you, yes, all of you, opened your arms and hearts to me in the ministry God has chosen for me and allowed me so many privileges and welcomed me into your lives. You allowed me to hold your children and welcome them into God's church through Baptism, helping them serve our God on the Altar, celebrate their wedding ceremonies and the honor of burying your dead; none of which I deserve.

After ordination, I felt a need for "more" of God's love, so I enrolled in a three year course studying the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola and was granted by Archbishop Hannan, the title of Spiritual Director and Retreat Director. Deacons called, "Introduction to Diaconal Ministry" which I taught for about 15 years.

When Archbishop Schulte came on board, I was asked to be one of the Masters of Ceremonies for the Diocese and I did that for about 25 years. In the meantime when things were lagging, I was also elected to the National Board of Directors for my normal duties here at St. Angela with Baptisms, Weddings and Funerals as the Permanent Deacons representing 5 States. This was all in conjunction with well as teaching the R.C.I.A. program for about 18 years as well as serving on the local Board of Directors and the Selection Board for the Deacons, not to mention being asked to be the spiritual director for four trips to Medjgorje.

There are other things that happened in the last 40 years, but I don't want to bore you with them. But this I can tell you, once you tie yourself to God's apron strings, life gets really interesting. Now that I have stepped down from the Altar and no longer serving or preaching at Mass, unless asked to do so, I am honored to work with many people assisting them through the annulment process in order to return to the Sacraments. What a joy this is for me! To think, I can help some more!

There are so many of you, my extended family, that have given me your love, kindness and prayers through these years, I don't think I will live long enough to say "thank you" to most of you. But, be assured of a large part of my daily prayers are for you and your families.

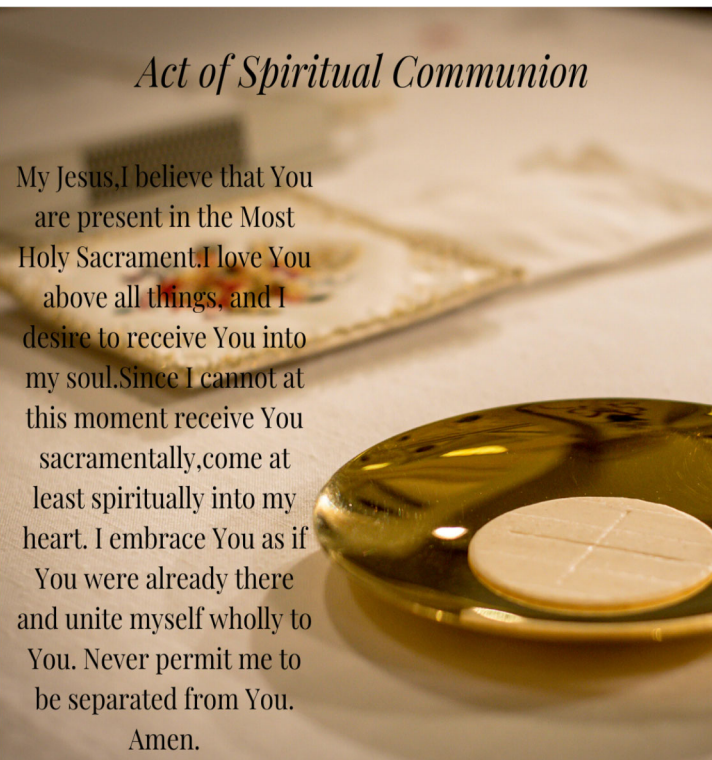

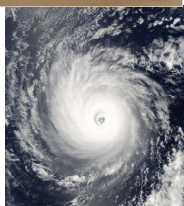

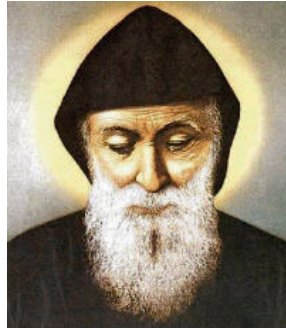

Saint of the Week

**SAINT SHARBEL MAKHLŪF
(1828-1898)
Feast Day: July 24**

The convenience store owner chatted animatedly in Arabic with coworkers, but hardly at all with his American clientele. So soon after 9/11, he probably figured, with my accent, the less said, the better. That changed when an American customer recognized Saint Sharbel's portrait on the wall: "So you're Lebanese Maronites!" The owner was happily incredulous: "You know our saint?" "Not at first," the customer admitted. "But we help the Catholic Near East Welfare Association, and their magazine published that picture and called Sharbel the 'Paradoxical Artisan of Peace.'" "Everyone thinks we're Muslims," said the owner, "and some of my workers are. Saint Sharbel helps us live together in peace!" A hermit for twenty-three years, little is known of Sharbel's life. He died after suffering a stroke while celebrating the liturgy. Miracles attributed to his intercession number in the thousands, and in war-torn Lebanon, Catholics, Orthodox, and Muslims pray together where his incorrupt body is entombed. How lovely if after our passing, we too could be remembered for having brought very different people to the one God, together in peace. —Peter Scagnelli, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

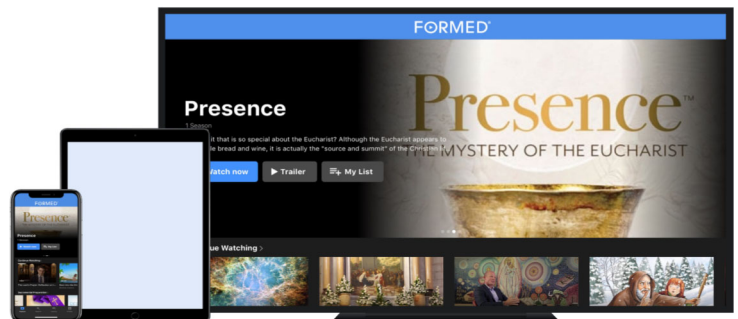

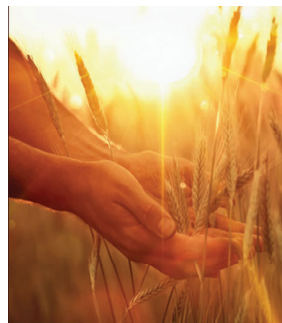

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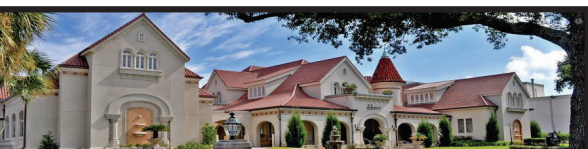
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
