

## The Gifts of the Magi

In the first reading, the prophet Isaiah, before telling us the Good News, notes the opposite spiritual truth: that "darkness covers the earth, and thick clouds cover the peoples." "But," he continues - and this

"but" makes all the difference - "upon you (Jerusalem) the Lord shines, and over you appears his glory." Isaiah wrote this after the defeat and exile of God's people (the darkness). But now His people are back home and the Temple of God has been rebuilt (the light, glory).

But wait - we realize that Isaiah isn't speaking to literal Jerusalem. Rather, he is prophesying to the then-future Messiah, addressing the capital city Jerusalem, the city of the great kings, as a figure of speech to speak to Jesus: "Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you." Isaiah peers into the future and sees Christ: "Nations shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining radiance." "All from Sheba will come bearing gold and frankincense, and proclaiming the praises of the Lord."

In the second reading, St. Paul explains something that God had not made known until then, but now "was made known by revelation." This new surprise from God is that He includes in his covenant, not only His ancient people the Israelites, but also us Gentiles (that is, all who are from other nations) who are "co-partners in the promise in Christ Jesus". What a gift! Without it, we Gentiles would be lost.

Today's Gospel reading begins with the urgent question posed by the Magi, who were Gentiles: "Where is the newborn King of the Jews?" "Magi" were members of the elite and educated class in several eastern lands, often professionals, rulers, and kings. These Magi had traveled from an unnamed country because they knew that a great king had been born in Judah. Judah's reigning king at the time was Herod, who had been enthroned illegally by the

Roman Empire to be their puppet. When King Herod learned of the Magi's arrival and the purpose of their search, he was "greatly troubled" to say the least, and so were many of the citizens, at the prospect of a rival king. Thus continues the ages-long tendency of the powerful, even the powerful of Jesus' own country, to oppose God. It was Gentiles, not Israelites, who were the first to recognize publicly that this new-born child was the King of the Jews,

the one who had been awaited for centuries, and who was the hope of the world. They had come to pay him homage by offering him the precious gifts of their trade that Isaiah had prophesied: gold, frankincense, and myrrh. If they had then reported back to Herod, as they had been asked to do, then Herod could have easily executed Jesus. But the Magi were warned in a dream not to return to Herod. So these foreign kings frustrated the illegal king in order to protect the Eternal King, by departing for their country

by another route.
