
Hospital Visits from Our Priests

Fr. Rijo, Fr. Tom and Fr. Benny would like to visit you when you are sick and wish to receive the sacraments.

Unfortunately, the hospital no longer asks if you have a religious preference when you are admitted to the hospital, so they have no way of knowing that you are in the hospital unless someone notifies us.

If you know in advance that you will be entering the hospital and would like a visit from a priest, please call the parish office at (802) 334-5066 before you go to the hospital to let us know. If you are admitted to the hospital in an emergency, either inform the hospital staff that you would like a visit from a priest, or ask a family member to notify us.


The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick can be administered whenever any Catholic feels the need for the special graces obtained from receiving this sacrament. Any admission to the hospital or surgery - whether or not it is life threatening - is a perfect time to ask to receive the Anointing of the Sick.



Jesus commanded us to proclaim the Good News to the entire world. What do you need to carry out this mission? Ask for the grace you need to spread His Word. Let us show our love as Jesus did.

Today's readings tell us of God's plan after Jesus ascends into Heaven. In Acts, Peter tells the remaining Apostles that it is time to fill the vacant 12th position. Why can't 11 Apostles continue this job? Well, twelve is the number of the Tribes of ancient Israel. They are thinking only of the ancient precepts. So, by drawing lots, the Apostles told the congregation the method they used to choose a candidate, which they saw as letting God make the choice, and Matthias was selected.



The second reading from 1 John explains what love really is. God loves us, so what should we do? Love one another. What happens if we love one another? God remains in us. How do we know God remains in us? God has given us the Spirit. What happens to those who acknowledge Jesus as Son of God? They remain in God and God remains in them. Who is God? God is love. What happens to those who remain in love? God remains in them and they remain in God. What a mouthful, but so true! If we follow the commandments and precepts of the Lord, we know that the greatest commandment is love and our faith grows stronger.

In today's Gospel, Jesus asks the Father to watch over the Apostles as Jesus did while He was on earth. The Apostles will continue Jesus' work on earth, with all the costs and rewards of love. Love may involve loss and letting go as it did for the Apostles and their families, Jesus, and the early disciples. We are not saying farewell to Jesus, but Jesus is handing His work to us also. The Apostles were sent throughout the world to proclaim the Good News, and the clergy, religious and today, even each one of us is called to be His voice, hands, and feet in the world.

Let us show our LOVE as Jesus did.

Prayer: *Lord Jesus Christ, You offer to those who follow You a yoke that is good to bear, a burden that is light. We therefore come to You for rest and comfort so that we may find the strength to continue spreading your Good News to all corners of this world. We pray all this, trusting in Jesus Name. Amen.*
