## To Rise Again

With their riddle about seven brothers and a childless widow in today's Gospel, the Sadducees were mocking

our faith. It is the faith that seven brothers and their mother died for in today's first reading.

These martyrs chose death rather than to betray God. Their story is recorded for us to strengthen us for endurance—so that our feet will not falter, but remain steadfast on His path. These martyrs died knowing that death itself is short, that God would raise them up, and that they would live again forever (see 2 Maccabees 14:46).

The Sadducees in the Gospel did not believe in the Resurrection because they could not find it literally written or taught in Scripture. To ridicule it, they challenged Jesus with a law that required a woman to marry her husband's brother if he should die without leaving an heir (Deuteronomy 25:5 and Genesis 38:8).

But God's Law was not given to ensure the raising up of descendants of earthly fathers. The Law was given, as Jesus explains, to make us worthy to be "children of God" - sons and daughters born of His love.

God our Father, St. Paul tells us in today's second reading, has given us "everlasting encouragement" in the Resurrection of Christ. Because of it, we can have the courage to never be disloyal to God. Rather, we can direct our hearts to the love of God. As the martyrs in today's first reading suffered for the Old Law, we will also have to suffer, Jesus said, for our faith in the New Covenant. And if we do, as today's Psalm tells us, He will guard us in the shadow of His wings and keep us as the apple of His eye. The martyrs' persecutors marveled at their courage. We too can glorify the Lord by our sufferings and in the daily sacrifices we make.

For we have an even greater cause for hope than they had! One who has risen from the dead has given us His word that He is the God of the living, and that when we awaken from the sleep of death, we will behold His face and be joyful beyond imagination in the love of His presence (Psalm 76:6 & Daniel 12:2).

So let us also always be courageous and loyal to our Lord, no matter what the enemy of our soul throws at us. Amen.


