# living liturgy

# Parable of the Sower

Today's readings tell how our relationship with God help us to grow and bear fruit.

In the first reading, the Prophet Isaiah explains how the rain and snow nourish the earth to produce fruit, much like the power and effectiveness of God's Word can nurture us. When we engage in God's Word, we receive life-giving nutrition from the Scriptures. As we read the second reading and the Gospel, we learned how Jesus compared the seeds and different types of soil the seeds fall on to our receptive hearts.

"Hear then the parable of the Sower. The seed sown on the path is the one who hears the Word of God without understanding it, and the evil one comes and steals away what was sown in his heart." Have you ever been to Holy Mass and listened to the first reading, responsorial psalm and second reading, then stood up and listened to God's Word in the Gospel and wondered, "What did I just hear?" This is the time when the seeds fall to the ground and the birds eat them. Maybe God's Words falls on rocky soil and spring up, but wither once the sun scorches them because they have no root system. Or perhaps God's Words fall on thorny ground and are choked when they try to grow. We humans often get choked by outside surroundings, shiny things, and what we can buy, or our attention is focused on something else - we get distracted and our hearts are not open to hear God's Word. Worldly things can get in the way of God's Word falling on fertile soil, taking root and nurturing our hearts.

We must make our hearts rich so the seed, or the Word of God, can nourish us. Our hearts must cultivate a spirit of openness, attentiveness, and receptivity to His Word as we read the Bible or listen to the Scripture readings. To bear fruit, the person who hears the Word and understands it is the one who gets the real nutrients of spiritual growth with roots deepened by faith. This is not always easy, but Revelations 1:3 tells us: "Blessed is the one who reads aloud and blessed are those who listen to this prophetic message and heed what is written in it."

It is time to read the Bible aloud, to listen to the Word of God with an open heart and soak it up like we soak up the rays of the sun to warm ourselves. Then we will have the new life we need to bear fruit – to go out and proclaim the Gospel of the Lord. That is discipleship and our mission to evangelize to others what God means to us.
