"The Look of Jesus"

"Jesus looked at him and said, you are Simon, the son of John. You shall be called Cephas (which means Peter)."

This look of Jesus was a look of choice. It entailed a calling, for Jesus had plans for Peter. He would commission him to continue His mission, to be the Rock who would give stability, strength and solidity as head of the college of the Apostles. This look of Jesus must have brought Peter immense joy and excitement.

However, in another scene during Christ's Passion, Jesus looked straight at Peter as he denied Him. This second look of compassion surely brought Peter sorrow and disappointment. Peter wept bitterly. Tradition has it that the tears caused furrows in Peter's cheeks.

Peter was indeed the rock, but what a porous rock he was! He just collapsed and crumpled before a servant girl and denied Jesus three times. Sadly, as the Gospel records, "Peter followed at a distance."

If we are to be faithful to Jesus, we need to follow Him very closely. When there is distance between us and Jesus, we are very likely to go our own way. Worse, we may lose sight and track of Jesus. The more we go our own way, the wider the distance becomes. When Jesus chooses and calls us, He already knows us inside out...our strengths and weaknesses, our assets and liabilities. He still chooses us, just as He chose Peter, knowing his weaknesses and liabilities. So let us close the distance between Jesus and ourselves and keep our eyes on the prize: Eternal Life with Him in Heaven.

PROCESS FOR SELECTING A BISHOP

The ultimate decision for appointing a bishop rests with the pope, and he is free to select anyone he chooses. But how does he know whom to select?



The process for selecting candidates normally begins at the diocesan level and works its way through a series of consultations until it reaches Rome. It is a process bound by strict confidentiality and can be a time-consuming process, often taking eight months or more to complete.

Stage 1: Priests/Bishops Recommendations

Priests may submit the names of priests they think would make good bishops. Discussions and meetings are held on which names to recommend. Once a list is developed, it is forwarded to the apostolic nuncio in Washington and to the U.S. Catholic Conference of Bishops.

Stage 2: The Apostolic Nuncio

The Apostolic Nuncio is the pope's representative to the government and the Catholic Church. He conducts his own investigation about the suitability of candidates and oversees the final list of names forwarded to Rome. What happens next? To be continued.......
