The Feast of the Most Holy Trinity

Today's readings invite us to reflect on the beautiful mystery and unity of the Holy Trinity. God is one, but also three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, showing us how God can be beyond our understanding and yet very close to us. The Father is in heaven, Jesus walked on earth to do the will of his Father, and the Holy Spirit is with us now to continue the work of Jesus. This helps us see that God is always with us in many different ways.

The first reading from Proverbs talks about wisdom. Wisdom was present from the beginning of creation as God planned and executed the creation of the universe. This Wisdom is part of God's truth. The Holy Spirit, as the Spirit of Truth, continues to share this Wisdom with us every day. When we understand that living in truth is living in harmony with God, the Holy Spirit will be our helper and guide and support us in all we do.

Just as the Father, Son and Holy Spirit share everything, we are given gifts and talents from the Father that He wants us to share with others. By embracing these lessons, we can live more faithfully as God wants us to.
