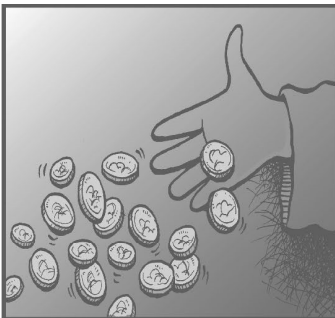

October 14, 2018 • Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The first reading is about wisdom. It is a love poem written to the object of the author's desire. The author loves wisdom itself and experiences wisdom as the source of all good things, all riches. The psalm tells us that wisdom is kindness. It is knowing and doing the work of God. It is understanding what our life is for. Hebrews recognizes that Wisdom is, in fact, the Word of God, Jesus. The source of our continuing life is Jesus. Mark makes this even more personal with the story of one man. A good man who has observed the laws from his youth, even in the loving presence of Jesus, cannot find the strength to leave his worldly possession behind and follow.



LETTING GO

Who does not strive to be successful? What good person does not want to be able to provide for their family all the necessities of life, to assure that they will have the means to feed, clothe, shelter, educate, and care for themselves and those they love as well as help their neighbors, strangers, the needy? Isn't that what is asked of us, to love God and our neighbor as ourselves? The readings today make clear that even more is required of us. We must do all those things and we must realize that doing so is only the first step to understanding what is at the center of our lives. We must realize that our accomplishments are not the measure of our value and worth. However successful or unsuccessful we are, our worth is measured by the truth that Jesus suffered, died, and rose for us. To truly know that, we must let go of everything else that roots us in time, space, and expectation and be willing to follow eternity.

¿Quién no se esfuerza para ser exitoso? ¿Qué persona buena no quiere poder proveer a su familia para todas las necesidades de la vida, asegurándose que tendrán los medios para alimentarse, vestirse, protegerse, educarse y cuidarse tanto ellos como aquellos a quienes aman y también ayudar a sus prójimos, forasteros y pobres? ¿Acaso no es eso lo que se nos pide, amar a Dios y a nuestro prójimo como a nosotros mismos? Las lecturas de hoy dicen claramente que se requiere aún más de nosotros mismos. Debemos hacer todas esas cosas y debemos darnos cuenta que hacerlas es solo el primer paso para entender lo que está en el centro de nuestras vidas. Debemos darnos cuenta que nuestros logros no son la medida de nuestro valor y dignidad. Sin importar lo exitoso o fracasado que estemos, nuestro valor se mide por la verdad de que Jesús sufrió, murió y resucitó por nosotros. Para verdaderamente saber eso, debemos dejar todo aquellos que nos enraíza en el tiempo, lugar y expectativas y estar dispuestos a seguir la eternidad.
