# The Second Sunday of Advent

"Prepare the way of the Lord..." (Mark 1:3) We are all called to live a holy life. We are all called to invite others to live holy lives. Living a stewardship lifestyle, being grateful and generous with our gifts, puts us on the path to holiness and is an example for others to be holy, too. We are responsible not only for our own lives, but for the lives of others as well.

### Christmas 2020

As with everything else in our lives in this remarkable year of 2020, arrangements for Christmas will need to be different this year. Some of those differences, masks, hand-sanitizing and social-distancing, we've grown used to over the last months.

Let me draw your attention to a number of changes.

- 1. Bishop McManus has extended the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass until the first Sunday of Lent, February 21.
- 2. Again with Bishop McManus's permission and at his suggestion, the first Mass on Christmas Eve can be celebrated at 3 p.m. Here at St. Columba we will have four Masses for Christmas: On Christmas Eve at 3 p.m. and 5 p.m. and on Christmas Day at 8 a.m. and 10 a.m. (This change is only for Christmas Eve. On Saturday, December 26—27, the Feast of the Holy Family, Masses will return to the usual times of 4 p.m., 8 a.m. and 10 a.m.)
- 3. Because the church has a limited seating capacity of 80 and since more people than usual come to Mass on Christmas, we will be using an online seat reservation system for the four Christmas Masses. It will be sent to you via Flocknote or you can find it on the parish website. Remember these stipulations as you make your reservation.
  - a. People who share an address can sit together in the same pew
  - b. People who do not share an address must be socially distanced, six feet apart.
- 4. When you arrive at the church, with your mask and having your hands sanitized, we'll check your name off the list of those who have reserved. Numbers can't be increased at that point.
- 5. Please tell your friends and acquaintances that they must reserve spaces beforehand. If they have not done so, we will have 20 extra spaces in the Hall where people will be able hear the Mass and where communion will be brought to them.
- 6. If you don't have computer access, call the rectory as soon as possible and we will make the reservation for you.
- 7. If you or anyone in your family feel at all unwell, please stay home, take it easy and get better as soon as possible.

### Retirement Fund for the Religious

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

On the weekend of December 13<sup>th</sup>, our parishes will be conducting the appeal for the Retirement Fund for Religious. Over the past year, this national collection assisted nearly 30,000 elderly sisters, brothers, and religious order priests. It is staggering to realize that only 29 of the 531 religious communities throughout the country are adequately funded for retirement.

As you may know, religious women and men were instrumental in establishing Catholic schools, hospitals, and charitable agencies. Often this progress came at great sacrifice, and many older sisters, brothers, and religious order priests served for little to no pay.

Today, hundreds of religious communities do not have enough retirement savings and struggle to provide for a growing number of elder members. Covid-19 has only increased the challenge to provide adequate care.

Just as our annual *Celebrate Priesthood* event helps our diocese to care for its retired diocesan priests, this national collection assists many religious communities which struggle to provide for aging members. Rising health-care costs and decreased income compound the struggle to provide adequate care. Your gift to the Retirement Fund for Religious provides vital funding for medications, nursing care, and more. It also helps religious congregations implement long-range retirement strategies, even as they continue to serve the People of God.

In his letter to the Galatians, St. Paul urges us to remain steadfast in helping others: "Let us not grow tired of doing good, for in due time we shall reap our harvest, if we do not give up" (Gal 6:9). During these unprecedented times, many are hurting and need our assistance, including elderly religious.

I recognize this is but one of numerous worthy causes in need of assistance; I ask simply that you consider giving to those who have given a lifetime. If you are unable to give during Mass, please mail your offertory envelope to your parish or donate through your parish's online giving platform, if available. In thanksgiving for their faithful service, please join me in supporting the Retirement Fund for Religious and in praying for God's blessing on our nation's elderly and infirm religious women and men.
