

Living in the Spirit



In his concluding message for the Jubilee Year of Mercy, Pope Francis announced the World Day for

the Poor. He said he wanted it to be celebrated annually on the Thirty-Third Sunday of Ordinary Time, a week before the

Solemnity of Christ the King, as "yet another tangible sign of this Extraordinary Holy Year." "This would be the worthiest way to prepare for the celebration of the Solemnity of our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, who identified with the little ones and the poor and who will judge us on our works of mercy,"



This past week, I was reflecting on the First World Day of the Poor and the Pope's message, which I would encourage you to read in its totality. In it the Holy Father states,

"We may think of the poor simply as the beneficiaries of our occasional volunteer work, or of impromptu acts of generosity that appease our conscience. However good and useful such acts may be... they ought to lead to a true encounter with the poor and a *sharing* that becomes a way of life... This way of life gives rise to joy and peace of soul, because we touch with our own hands the *flesh of Christ*. If we truly wish to encounter Christ, we have to touch his body in the suffering bodies of the poor, as a response to the sacramental communion bestowed in the Eucharist. The Body of Christ, broken in the sacred liturgy, can be seen, through charity and sharing, in the faces and persons of the most vulnerable of our brothers and sisters"

The Pope then goes on to quote Saint John Chrysostom's admonition which remains true even today: "If you want to honour the body of Christ, do not scorn it when it is naked; do not honour the Eucharistic Christ with silk vestments, and then, leaving the church, neglect the other Christ suffering from cold and nakedness."

At our last Pastoral Council meeting, on November 13, Gail and Bryan Kindlon, coordinators of the Outreach Committee, reported on the numerous activities of the committee and their many dedicated volunteers. It is absolutely amazing to see the tremendous generosity that pours forth from the hands of so many within our community, which enable the committee to reach out and "touch" the lives of the needed in our area. A full report of their activities and the work of many others that touch the "suffering Christ" in our midst will be forthcoming. New this year was the committee's commitment to provide volunteers to serve dinner one night per month at the House of Mercy. Under discussion is also potential of providing and sharing a monthly meal with the residents of Bethany House.

Perhaps the best way to acknowledge and thank the many that fulfill the mission of Christ in our midst is to once again quote Pope Francis: "Blessed, therefore, are the open hands that bring hope. Blessed are the hands that reach beyond every barrier of culture, religion and nationality, and pour the balm of consciousness over the wounds of humanity. Blessed are the open hands that ask nothing in exchange, with no "ifs" or "buts" or "maybes": they are the hands that call down God's blessing upon their brothers and sisters."
