BANNS OF MARRIAGE

Dear Friends,

As you may know, two years ago the Diocese filed for reorganization under Chapter 11 of the US Bankruptcy Code because the number of claims for sexual abuse of minors in past decades is greater than the Diocese's ability to satisfy them. Please note: it is the Diocese which is in bankruptcy, not the parishes. Nevertheless, the parishes will be asked to contribute (along with the diocesan corporation and several insurance companies) to the pool of monies out of which all the claims will be settled.

There are two reasons why the parishes need to contribute, even though we are not in bankruptcy. First, although the Diocese and each parish are legally separately incorporated, we are in fact one Roman Catholic Church. We are one community of faith and we are all in this trouble together. A second and more practical reason the parishes need to contribute is that the diocesan corporation is not the only entity liable for past sexual abuse. Many parishes have also been sued. In order to resolve the matter, the Diocese is asking the bankruptcy judge permission to join all the claims together—parochial and diocesan—under the diocesan umbrella and in the process to discharge any and all claims against the parishes. However the bankruptcy judge will free the parishes from past claims of abuse only if the parishes as a whole contribute to the diocesan settlement fund.

While we are not aware of any valid claims for sexual abuse of minors against any of the Brighton parishes, even so we will need to join with all of the other parishes in our twelve-county diocese in contributing to the settlement. How much each parish will be assessed has not yet been determined since the mediation process has been moving very slowly. The judge recently ordered the parties to move more seriously and quickly to agreement on a suitable and realistic amount to satisfy the claims. When that amount is determined, then a formula will be developed to detail how much each parish must contribute. We will keep you informed of further developments as they unfold.
