REFLECTIONS WITH FATHER MICHAEL: PATIENCE, THE VIRTUES OF ADVENT

Today is the second Sunday of Advent in this year B cycle. This is the Sunday whose Liturgy highlights the importance of patience on life's journey. Some of us over-look or pay lip-service to this important virtue, but it shouldn't be so. Patience is a key ingredient for success in any venture. Without it despair may be the result. But what makes patience a necessary virtue on life's journey? The answer is both simple and complex; because we need patience to survive daily on life's ups and downs, but it is a difficult virtue to cultivate. It requires ardent faith in God and sustained humility. Without humility patience will elude us. We need it in order to hold unto patience firmly.

Patience helps us not to lose hope, because it reminds us that no condition is permanent in this life. It also reminds us that the wheels of time rolls on daily, and what it brings today is not necessarily what it may bring tomorrow; the only constant in life is change.

The prophet Isaiah hammered this truth home to his country men and women long ago and to us today. He reminds us, as he reminded his contemporaries many centuries ago, that no condition is permanent in this world, and that God has the last word in our trials.

With words of comfort Isaiah enjoined his people to be patient and keep hope alive in their struggle. God, he said, was not going to abandon them to their fate as exiles and marginalized people, instead, the Savior would be coming to in due course to set them free from bondage and misery. In the prophet's own words in our first reading this Sunday, he said what God told him to say to suffering people of Israel, "Comfort, give comfort to my people. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and proclaim to her that her service is at an end, her guilt is expiated..." How wonderful the Lord is! And, how amazing is his mercy and forgiveness!

My fellow reflectors and friends, this is precisely the God that the season of Advent is preparing us to encounter. He is the God who never fails, God that never abandons his people in their sins and misery. We cannot afford not to prepare well to welcome this great Lord and Liberator---- the Alpha and Omega of our lives. We must muster every effort to get ready to encounter our great Redeemer.

Last week we suggested certain things we should do to help us be in a better position to welcome the Lord in our lives. These include, but not limited to, reading and meditating on our Bible regularly, praying our rosaries, and taking our Sacraments seriously, especially the Eucharist etc.

We were also reminded of the need for to deepen our prayer-life, as well be more generous spirit during this grace-filled season. Let us remember that it is more blessed to give than to receive. Therefore sharing our gifts and talents with those in need is far better than grabbing from others. As St. Paul reminds us in his Letter to the Corinthians, "God loves a cheerful giver."

When we do these things on a consistent basis, our virtue of patience will grow on life's journey, because God who is never out-done in generosity won't fail us with this important virtue if we use our talents generously.

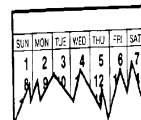
Thursday, December 14th @ 6:00pm in the church, we will be packing Santa's family bags for 50 families. Come and help us load each bag of toys and books for each child.

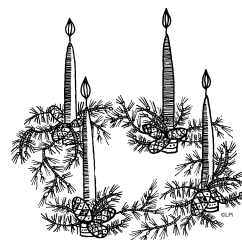

The Advent Symbols

Two of the best-known symbols of the Advent season are use of the liturgical colors (blueish/violet and pink) and the Advent Wreath. The primary liturgical color of Advent is a blueish/violet, the color of royalty. This symbolizes both the coming of the King of Israel at Christmas and the anticipated triumphant Second Coming of Christ. (Usage of blueish/violet has emerged recently to help avoid confusion with Lenten colors.) Pink, however, is used on the third Sunday of Advent, traditionally called Gaudete Sunday (from the Latin for rejoice). This rejoicing stems from passing the halfway point in Advent and from the readings of that week.

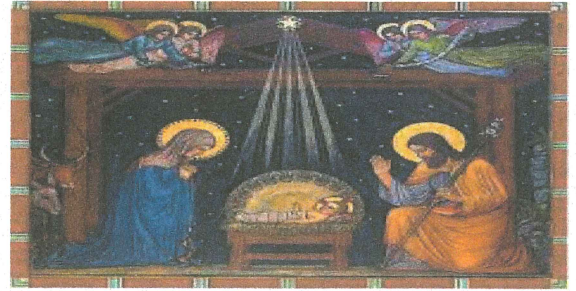
