

The other good news will also put additional smiles on our faces and bring hope to our peculiar situation, as we struggle mightily to continue to keep the doors of St. Raymond-OLGC open for future generation. By God's grace a Charter School is expected to take off at St Raymond vacant school building, come September this year. Wow! Can any news be more exciting than this at this point in time in our struggle? Efforts are currently underway to insure that the grade school starts this Fall. Without a doubt, this is another area that calls for our daily prayer. We must continue to pray until something happens! Although it is estimated that it will take more than \$250,000.00 to bring the vacant building up to code, everything possible will be done to insure that this opportunity is not missed.

Announcements for the Week of Sunday, June 24, 2018 Welcome Back Home Alumni!!!

- 1. We want to thank Mr. Calvert Bailey and the entire Bailey family for their generosity in donating a new air-condition unit to OLQH-GS rectory to replace the one that got damaged recently. The generosity is greatly appreciated. May God's smile rest on you all!
- 2. As already indicated in our reflections this Sunday, we are very hopeful that a new Charter School will take off at St. Raymond-Our Lady of Good Counsel by September this year. It is hoped that this grade school will help to continue move the parish forward in the right direction it is already poised to head to. Although the cost of repairing the damage caused to the vacant school building and bringing it up to code is at least two hundred and fifty thousand dollars, (\$250,000.00), it is worth every effort to get the new school started this year because of the enormous potentials. Let's keep this important project in our thoughts and prayer for God's guidance.
- 3. Have you by now made your C.S.A. contribution or pledge this year? If so, thank you so much, because you are part of the progress of our faith-community. But, if you are yet to embrace this important responsibility, kindly do so without further delay, because all hands are needed to move the parish forward. No one is to sit on the fence in this regard. Thank you.
- 4. Please, watch out for the new Mass schedule, as well as our Evangelization discussion schedule next Sunday, July 1st. In the mean, we are glad to announce that this year's Mission Appeal in aid of overseas missions, will take place as follows: Saturday and Sunday, July 21 and 22 at St. Raymond-OLGC; Saturday and Sunday August 4 and 5 at Our Lady Queen of Heaven-Good Shepherd. Please, let's take note of these dates and get ready to welcome the visiting Missionaries this summer. May God bless you as you do so.
- 5. On account of our high DTE ENERGY monthly bills, all our boilers have now been shut down for the summer, to save us some money during this warm period. At OLQH-GS, for instance, the monthly DTE ENERGY bill is not less than six thousand dollars (\$6,000.00) At St Raymond-OLGC, it averages twenty-five hundred per month, (\$2500.00) especially in the winter months. At the former Good Shepherd campus, it averages about eighteen hundred dollars (\$1800.00) per month. With our meager resources in these churches, it is only prudent to curtail expenses wherever possible. This is why we cannot afford to keep the boilers on during this warm season. To this end, however, it is hoped that we all will understand and appreciate the situation, and endeavor to dress appropriately whenever the weather changes suddenly during this period before late September. We are all in this together. Making little sacrifices for our faith-community is our common duty. This important announcement will be in our bulletins throughout this month of June to insure that no one will miss it. Thanks for your understanding and cooperation.
- 6. Are you aware that our summer vacation Bible School for this year will start on Tuesday July 10, and end on Friday July 13? As in the past, participants will be served with breakfast and lunch throughout the period. Venue for this year's summer Bible School titled "FAITH HEROES" will be at St Raymond-Our Lady of Good Counsel. It will be for both parishes. Please, let everybody spread this good news, and mobilize the kids in your neighborhoods to come and hear the Word of God, and also have lots of fun activities during the period, including singing and dancing. Praise the Lord!
