REFLECTIONS WITH FATHER MICHAEL

EVIL VISITED INNOCENT SCHOOL CHILDREN IN TEXAS

As we may recall, it wasn't long ago this year that unspeakable evil visited High School students at Oxford Michigan. We were all stunned. We lacked words to express our disbelief and shock over such horrifying evil. We wondered what could cause a young boy to carry out such a horrific act. Was he too drunk to reason? Or was he under the influence of Satan? Or all of the above?

Before we could find an answer to the questions, behold another senseless massacre unfolded before us. Where? This time it was the turn of Buffalo in New York. Another armed young man, aged 18 years, decided to eliminate those who did not look like him. As was with the case at Oxford, grief filled our hearts as we contemplated the heinous act that has left families orphaned and a peaceful community turned up-side-down. What a world! Is there hope for our world and our children?

As if these two recent carnages were not enough, another evil struck a devastating blow on innocent children at Robb Elementary School in Uvalde, Texas. When the dust settled nineteen children and two teachers paid the ultimate price for our addiction to assorted, military-style guns. As was the case in the earlier shootings in Oxford and Buffalo, the culprit was again a young guy of eighteen year of old.

My fellow reflectors and friends, are these evils unavoidable? Must we resign ourselves to them as inevitable? Simply put, are we to learn to embrace these evils as the "new normal"? It is difficult to imagine how we can hold our nose and muster the courage to dance with unspeakable evil such as these. I don't think it is possible. Something must be done to save our children and ourselves. We definitely can do much better as followers of the Risen Lord who has promised us His unfailing presence till the end of the world.

Before ascending to His Father in Heaven, Christ Jesus told us to be courageous because He has overcome the world and evil, and He also assured us of His continued presence through the Holy Spirit that would make us effective witnesses of His mission of love and peace. The Lord has done His part, He has ascended to His heavenly Father, and sent us the Paraclete whose coming we celebrate this Sunday, June 5, 2022. The big question then is, are we doing our own part? Are we allowing the Holy Spirit to inhabit us and empower us for the love of Christ, the mission of love?

Make no mistake about it, evil does not restrict its unwelcome visits to Oxford High School, Supermarket in Buffalo, and Robb Elementary School in Uvalde, Texas. It can visit families, workplaces, places of worship, and even parish offices! Those who carefully followed the sad events in our Family of Parishes office in April must have noticed evil doesn't always go about with guns and bombs. It can come in the form of falsehood, lies, and character assassination. Even our Bosom friend can become an agent of falsehood, stabbing you at the back for selfish reasons. One of the obvious characteristics of evil is, surprise and harmful falsehood. Another favorite weapon of agents of falsehood is inability to confront truth face to face. They go to any length to avoid facing the truth.

But we should never despair when evil hovers in our environment. Instead, we should stand firm, relying on the Lord who said to followers, "Be courageous, for I have overcome the world and evil." Trusting in the Lord and praying for those who spread harmful lies against us, we can rest assured that truth will ultimately prevail over blackmail and falsehood. History bears testimony to that.

The good news is, the Lord sent us the Holy Spirit to empower us to witness to the truth. Let us endeavor to stand by the truth, because it will set us free if we allow it dwell in us irrespective of any falsehood heaped on us by detractors or betrayers. Therefore, as we rejoice and celebrate the solemnity of Pentecost this Sunday, and at the same time mourn the senseless losses at Oxford, Michigan, Buffalo, New York, and Uvalde Texas, let us remember that evil has no boundaries. It can creep into our families, workplaces, and faith-community in different forms. Good enough, the Paraclete reminds us that only LOVE, not BITTERNESS, can heal our wounds, real or imagined.

Have a wonderful celebration! And stay in God's loving care! Please, remember that on June 12, a week today, we will have a combined Mass in solidarity with Our Lady Queen of Heaven-Good Shepherd, as they celebrate their modified Good Times annual festival. May you be blessed as you participate! AMEN!!

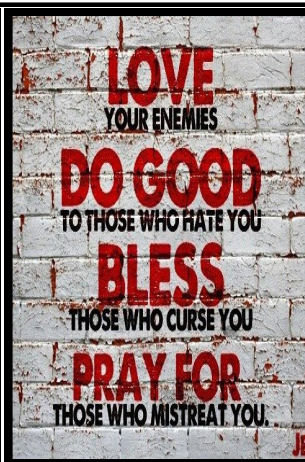
