## REFLECTIONS WITH FATHER MICHAEL:

### *APPRECIATING DIVINE PROVIDENCE IN OUR LIVES*

The great and saintly American Bishop, Fulton Sheen, said that humans can be divided into two major groups. The first group has people who wake up daily with a smile on their faces and exclaim, "O thank God for another day!" But the second group contains people who wake up every morning with a frown on their faces and say, "O my God, another trouble-filled day!"

My dear sisters and brothers, in which of these camps would you find yourselves? In other words, does joy or gratitude shape your day, or rather sadness and complaint? As we all know, attitude can be everything in life. A positive attitude can lift a person up even in the midst of the greatest tragedy, but a poor and negative attitude can drown and doom even the brightest prospects. The way we approach life every morning is very important, because it can determine the course of the entire day.

Do we begin the day with prayer and sincere gratitude in our hearts or do we start with complaints and fault-finding? It is important to learn to appreciate the grace of God in our lives, the grace that enables us to wake up from sleep every day and have a brand-new day at our disposal. It is not by our own hard work but solely out of God's goodness and compassion.

In this special month of thanksgiving, let us strive to thank and appreciate the Lord for all He does in us and for us and our loved ones. Even lives that seem challenging or daunting on the surface, must not lose sight of the fact that the hand of the Lord is still working somewhere mysteriously beneath the surface. Without God, things could have been worse. The truth of the matter is, God is never far from His children and from those who sincerely invoke Him.

Not long ago, two 5th-graders were asked to enumerate what three major things they value most in their lives and for which they thank God daily. One outlined these blessings, good health, his good and loving parents, and his excellent grade in the school exams. The other student stated that she was grateful to God that her sick mom was still alive despite all the major surgeries she had gone through in recent years. She was also thankful that God saved her older brother from a very serious accident that totaled their family minivan not long ago. No one died in that terrible crash. With a smile on her face, she added that she was equally grateful that before the next Summer her family would be able to own a home rather than continuing to live in a rented home. She said, "I can't wait for that day!"

Each of those two kids were grateful for something valuable to him or her. And they directed their gratitude primarily to God, not to humans. Even the one who did very well in exams did not attribute the excellence to himself but rather as something to give God thanks. What a lesson!

What struck me about the girl's thanksgiving, however, was the fact that she took time to appreciate God's hand in keeping her sick mother alive despite chronic health challenges. Did she complain and blame God for the condition of her mom? Not at all! No complaints or blame on God for not giving her mother a sound health, instead there was gratitude in her heart. Also, there was not any complaint for the fact that her family didn't own a home, but instead she was grateful that they would eventually own a home. What a great lesson for those of us who prefer to think negatively instead of positively! Indeed, it is a wonderful lesson for folks who chronically prefer to see the cup as "half-empty", rather than "half-full"!


My fellow reflectors and friends, what about you? Are you someone of complaints or gratitude? Which of the two camps do you fall into? In other words, do you belong to the camp of those who chronically complain about everything under the earth, or the camp of those who say, "Thank God for another day"? Only our conscience can answer that question. But let's face it, the month of November-- the month of Thanksgiving, reminds us to form the good habit of gratitude to our God and Maker. We owe our life and talents to Him, and *without Him we can do nothing (John 15:5)* Let's therefore learn to begin each day with a prayer of gratitude. And, let our gratitude to the Lord also affect and permeate all we do in our families and communities, so that we learn to appreciate the gifts and blessings of one another. Not easy, but we can take a baby step each day.

As Pope Francis pointed out in his 2017 general audience, "there is so much to be grateful to God for, but words are too feeble to express them." I agree. This explains why we should not just stop at saying, "Thank you, Lord, for your blessings," but also do more to show in concrete deeds that we truly appreciate God's goodness and blessings. Without a doubt, we are blessed far more than we can realize, no matter our situation. Therefore, let's learn to form the habit of gratitude to the Lord, and to one another.

May our Thanksgiving this year help us to be more appreciative of God's blessings. Amen!

1. Have you voted by now? Remember, whether you choose to vote by absentee or in person, every Christian is a disciple of life. We are to choose the culture of life, not the culture of death prevalent in our world today. At the ballot box, bear in mind that we are called to uphold the sanctity of life, and not the "culture of death. Please, approach the November 8 with your Christian conscience intact! Thank you.
2. We congratulate **St. Jude parishioners** for the successful celebration of St. Jude feast day, including the nine -day Novena that ended on Friday October 28 with Benediction. Many thanks to **Bishop Hanchon** for presiding at the Sunday Mass that concluded the long celebration. From the feedback we received so far it seemed everyone enjoyed the uplifting celebration. We cannot fail to thank all who worked hard to make the occasion a success, including **Diane Garrison and her team of helpers** who ensured that everyone was fed. A lot of thanks must also go to our lectors and other functionaries drawn from our three parishes who did a great job, just as the combined choir and our **two Organists and choir directors, Don and John**. To you all, not forgetting the priests who concelebrated at special Mass, our **altar boys, the Ushers, Family Council chairperson and secretary, as well as our Sacristan, Azeem and his family** etc., may the Lord bless you with His unfailing care!
3. Recently, parishes in the Archdiocese of Detroit conducted the annual board of directors meeting during which the pastors as presidents, gave their annual report of the state of each parish. Members of the board have requested that I publish and distribute the report to parishioners to keep everyone informed. To this end the summary of the report will be found in the bulletin inserts for the respective parishes. Please, look for that important report in your church's bulletin inserts. If your bulletin does contain the inserts, kindly contact your parish office to obtain your copy without delay.
- \*\*4. With the provisional time for Sunday and Saturday Masses now settled for St. Raymond-OLGC and Our Lady Queen of Heaven-GS for at least the next six months, our attention will now be focused on, among other things, the gradual implementation of our Family of Parishes Mission Strategic Plan (MSP) and hiring a Development Director who will be primarily responsible for fundraising in the Trinity Family of Northeast Detroit, starting with Raymond-OLGC where the Director will be headquartered and continue, among other things, to manage the money-making Millennium raffle. Please, let us keep this important project in our thoughts and prayer for God's guidance. In the meantime, however, after six months or thereabouts we will be reviewing the current Mass time for OLQH-GS and St. Raymond-OLGC, to make sure that it is effectively serving the purpose for which it was set. Also, starting on the first Sunday in January 2023 the Sunday Mass at St. Jude will be at 10.30am, not 10am. Please, let us start to prepare for this little change taking place in January.

Venue for this meeting will be at **Our Lad Queen of Heaven-GS Hall**. Meal will be served prior to the start of the meeting. So, members be on time to have your meal before the meeting kicks off at 6.30pm.


\*8. As we all are aware, we now have dates for **our next four combined Masses between now and September 2023**: These dates and venues are as follows: **January 15 at St. Raymond-OLGC**; **April 30, at St. Jude**; **June 11 at Our Lady Queen of Heaven-GS**, and **September 24 at St. Raymond-OLGC**. **At each of these combined Mass**, there will be adoration of the Blessed Sacrament at the tail end in keeping with our participation in the ongoing year of reverence to the Eucharist. There may be another combined Mass before 2023 runs out, but that is still being worked out. Please, let's mark these dates on our calendar as we get ready for these special events which may include individual testimonies etc.

\*9. Volunteers are still being needed at our three parishes to help out in any way they can, including cleaning, answering phones, helping out with St. Vincent De Paul, or Deo Gratias ministries, or just helping to put inserts in the bulletin whenever needed etc. It is a well-known fact that parishes that lack regular volunteers cannot make meaningful progress into the future. Every viable parish needs a team of dedicated volunteers. They are unavoidable. Think about it and contact your parish office if you are interested in volunteering once a week or once every month for about three hours or more. You will be blessed by the Lord.
