

Coursework Requirements


- 4 credits of Religion4 credits of English
- 4 credits of Math
- 3 credits of Science
- 3 credits of Social Studies
- 1 Fine Art credit
- 1 Economics/Personal Finance credit
- ½ credit of Physical Education or Athletic Waiver (2) seasons of a sport)½ credit of Health
- 5 credits of additional electives (Art, Science, Social Studies, English, etc.)

Total: 26 credits






















Demonstrate Readiness: Students MUST earn at least two Diploma Seals, one must be <u>State</u> defined and the other can be <u>Locally</u> defined. Students have the opportunity to earn state defined Citizenship and Biology Seals by earning a proficient score on both the Social Studies and Science IOWA assessments.

Seals will be affixed to the student's diploma and transcript to indicate academic, technical, and professional readiness for careers, college, the military or self-sustaining professions.


