FROM THE PRINCIPAL:

Yesterday, we were able to attend the Bishop's Rally and Mass that was held by the Diocese of Cleveland. It was a unique and inspiring experience for all who attended. FROM THE DEAN OF STUDENTS:

Yesterday was a remarkable day as we participated in the Bishop's Rally & Mass at the Cleveland Public Auditorium. I am pleased to announce that our students' behavior was exemplary, with only a few minor deviations. In comparison to other schools attending this event, our students' conduct was undoubtedly exceptional. The bishop addressed themes of love, peace, and maintaining integrity within Catholic schools. These principles and ideas align with our collective aspiration to instill within the culture and fabric of VASJ. Our objective is to foster a rich and cultivated culture rooted in Catholic values while acknowledging and valuing each individual's contributions to the school.

Earlier this month, I emphasized the significance of discussing with students the prohibition of wearing masks or Halloween makeup on school premises. Notably, young children will be present at our annual Halloween On Campus event, where our seniors engage in activities to entertain and collaborate with our young guests. It is important to emphasize that ONLY SENIORS are permitted to dress up for this day, as it constitutes a community service requirement for graduation and a rite of passage for our students. Any underclassmen who disregard this policy will face disciplinary actions, including suspension.

Lastly, as the season transitions from summer to fall, there will be notable changes in weather and building temperatures. This is an opportune time to visit our school store and purchase additional sweaters, long-sleeve t-shirts, and other items to ensure your child's warmth and reduce the risk of illness. *It is important to note that hoodies, coats, jackets, and quarter-zip pullovers are prohibited from being worn during school hours, even if the item has our school logo.* Violators may face consequences, including suspension or dismissal from school.

College Now can assist you and your student with the following:

- Completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the CSS Profile (if required)
- Exploring available financial aid resources for college, including scholarships, loans, work-study, and private funding
- Interpreting and comparing financial aid award letters
- Recommending students for scholarships administered by College Now (requires Pell-Grant eligibility and specific GPA and ACT/SAT test score guidelines)

To schedule an appointment, go to the electronic sign up at https://cngc.org/VASJ-CNGC. This will bring you to the Bookings scheduling page. (Follow the directions on the other side of this handout to schedule your College Now appointment on Bookings.) In the event of a school closure, College Now appointments will be held by phone or through a virtual meeting. You will be contacted via the email or cell number you provided during sign up if your appointment is adjusted in any way.

NCAA Eligibility Center: ANY JUNIOR OR SENIOR who is a student-athlete and is thinking about participating in sports at the college level, MUST register with the NCAA Eligibility Center. You should create a free Profile Page account if you are thinking of becoming a college-bound student-athlete. By creating an account, you will stay connected & receive the most current information from the NCAA Eligibility Center and it can help you decide what NCAA division might be right for you.
