FROM THE DEAN OF STUDENTS:

Hello Vikings family,

We are pleased to announce that we have made significant strides in enhancing our school culture this year. Notably, we have achieved zero out-of-school suspensions, implemented new and updated security equipment, and implemented a revised hall pass system.

We are proud to acknowledge that VASJ welcomes the brightest minds and most talented students, and we recognize the exceptional standards they set for excellence, dedication, and success. Consequently, we have set high expectations for our students, holding them accountable for their actions and rewarding positive behaviors.

In contrast, some nearby schools have reported record-high out-of-school suspensions during the initial 30-day period of the school year. In contrast, VASJ has maintained a calm and productive school environment, free from such suspensions. This achievement reflects the unwavering commitment and professionalism of our educators and the unwavering unity, integrity, and school spirit of our students.

To ensure a drug-free environment that fosters student growth and achievement, we have installed state-of-the-art air quality sensors that detect smoke, carbon monoxide, and mold. These Al-based devices can also identify tobacco and marijuana vape emissions, as well as tobacco and cannabis smoke. Furthermore, we have installed Al cameras that correlate with these detectors, enabling us to swiftly pinpoint the source of smoke or vape emissions. Students caught smoking, vaping, or suspected of engaging in such activities will be in direct violation of our drug and alcohol policy, which may result in expulsion.

Additionally, we have implemented a new hall pass system called MINGA. Students are now required to sign out of class to use restrooms, access lockers, or travel to other classes or locations. Upon their return, they must sign back in. This system significantly enhances our ability to monitor student traffic and effectively address unnecessary movement. Students are provided with five digital passes per day.

With your help, I believe we can create a safe, fun and unique learning environment for our students. VASJ students, let's make this year amazing, but don't do it for me. Do it for your FAITH, do it for your FAMILY, do it for your FUTURE!

When doing service outside of school remember these guidelines, which are also listed on pg. 47 of the student handbook:

- No money or other compensation may be received for this service, including benefits in co-curricular activities such as earning Varsity letters for participation.
- All service must be done with or for a marginalized group such as children, the elderly, the poor, etc.
- All service must be done for a registered non-profit organization unless otherwise approved by the Director of Campus Ministry.
- Service at "in-home" childcare providers does not meet VASJ service requirements and will not be approved or accepted.
- Students may not complete service hours at the place of employment of a relative or other acquaintance unless it
 is completed through the official "Volunteer Office." For example, if volunteering at a hospital, make arrangements
 for service through the Volunteer Office. If service is completed at a school, arrangements must be made with the
 approval of the principal or other authority and the service must be completed with someone other than the
 relative/acquaintance.
- Service must also be done outside of normal school hours. Students cannot leave class to complete service.

As a reminder of the grade level requirements:

• **FRESHMAN:** Completed at Freshman Retreat on August 14, 2025. If you were not present for the retreat, 10 hours need to be completed.

- SOPHOMORES: 15 hours completed at nonprofits outside of school hours
- **JUNIORS:** 25 hours completed at nonprofits outside of school hours
- **SENIORS:** Participation in/at Halloween on Campus, Christmas on Campus, AND completion of 2 page reflection paper. Absence from either event is made up with 10 hours of service completed at nonprofits outside of school hours.

GEM: What is GEM? GEM (Girls Empowerment Meetings) is a club geared towards young ladies who are seeking a safe space to share and discuss the unique experiences that bond us as women and participate in activities that aim to enhance self-image, self- confidence, and other topics pertaining to opportunities for women. Potential topics include: healthy relationships, women in the media, women in the workforce, conflict resolution/ relationships with friends, sexual assault awareness. The club sheds a positive light on what it means to be a happy, healthy, and strong female. GEM meets monthly. Our first meeting is on Wednesday, September 24 at 3:15 p.m.-4:15 p.m.

What Kind Of Activities Do We Do In GEM? Our club activities vary at each meeting. Every month, we focus on a specific topic and structure our discussions and activities around it. Some of our previous topics and activities have included self-defense, etiquette, career night, a women's panel, self-image, self-love, self-respect, and communication, including discussions on gossip among women.

Why Should Girls Attend?

- Personal Development: GEM provides opportunities to develop important life skills such as leadership, communication, and self-confidence.
- Supportive Environment: The meetings offer a safe space to share experiences and challenges while receiving support from peers who may be facing similar situations.
- Varied Topics: GEM covers a wide range of topics, from self-defense and etiquette to career development and self-image, offering diverse learning opportunities.
- Networking: Attendees can connect with like-minded individuals, mentors, and guest speakers, expanding their personal and professional networks.
- Empowerment: The focus on issues like self-respect, communication, and empowerment equips participants with the tools to navigate personal and societal challenges with confidence.

FROM THE COUNSELING DEPARTMENT: This week we recognized World Suicide Prevention Day on September 10th. Counselors set up a table to inform students on suicide awareness and offered resources.

Next week we will once again participate in the Sandy Hook "Start with Hello". The "Start With Hello" program empowers your students to reduce social isolation and to help strengthen school communities by teaching strategies for building strong peer relationships. "Start With Hello" encourages students to reach out and support their peers. We have created activities that students can participate in during their lunch periods to help promote "Start with Hello"

PARKING PERMITS: Parking permits are required for students this school year. The cost of the parking permit is \$50.00 and can be paid with cash, check or credit card. Students are to see Mrs. Taraska in the Principal's Office for a permit request form for a parent to complete. Once they return the completed form with payment, they will receive their permit and parking spot. Beginning October 1st, any student car parked without a permit will be towed at the owner's expense. Spots are still available.

FROM THE CLINIC: 12th Graders: A SECOND dose of MCV4 (Meningococcal A) vaccine is required for all 12th grade students in the state of Ohio. <u>Medication Orders for 2025-2026:</u> New orders are required yearly for medications. Please make sure your doctor completes a new medication order over the summer if your student needs medication in school next year.
