



ITALY PILGRIMAGE DAY 7 SAN GIOVANNI ROTONDO AND THE CAVE OF ST MICHAEL (PART TWO)

After we visited San Giovanni Rotondo we had a stunning view of the Gargano Peninsula as we traveled to the Grotto of St. Michael the Archangel. Saints, popes, and people from all over have come there looking for the protection and intercession of St. Michael. This sight is very interesting. The first apparition of St Michael on this sight was around the year 490. A wealthy land owner had lost one of his best bulls, he found it, after a long search, kneeling on top of a mountain before a cave entrance. The man out of anger at his bull, shot an arrow at it to get its attention, however, the arrow—unexpectedly hit his foot instead. There was no way that an arrow shot from a bow could have hit himself in a normal way when it was pointed away from himself, so this shook the man up enough to make him bring this to the bishop's attention. Hearing about this extraordinary event, the bishop ordered three days of fast and prayer to discern what was happening. After this time the Archangel Michael appeared to the bishop and said to him, "I am the Archangel Michael, and am always in the presence of God. The cave is sacred to me, I have chosen it; I myself am its watchful custodian... Where there the rock opens wide the sins of men can be forgiven... What is asked for here in prayer will be granted. Therefore, go to the mountain and dedicate the

Unfortunately, the bishop hesitated to do what was asked at first because the mountain was hard to access because of how high it was and it had been a place of pagan worship in the past.

Two years later in what is known as the Victory Episode' a vastly outnumbered and besieged town of Siponto was at the point of surrender. The bishop, Saint Lawrence, obtained a three-day truce and turned to the Celestial Leader with faith, prayer and penance. At the end of the three days, the Archangel appeared to the bishop and foretold a complete victory. This message filled the besiegeds' hearts with confidence. The defenders left the town and fought a furious battle accompanied by thunderbolts and lightning of extraordinary intensity. The victory of the people of the town of Siponto was complete with the extermination of the enemy.

After this victory, in what is known as the dedication episode, the Bishop Lawrence decided to consecrate the cave to St Michael, however, St Michael appeared to him and told him that he had already consecrated the grotto. So the bishop of Siponto, along with several other bishops, clergy and laity decided to go and dedicate the grotto to St Michael. As they traveled in procession to the holy place, a number of eagles flew overhead and shielded the group from the rays of the sun with their outstretched wings. When they arrived at the grotto they found that a primitive altar had already been erected and was covered with an altar cloth and surmounted by a cross. They also found the footprints of St Michael imbedded in the rock. The grotto itself is the only place of worship not consecrated by human hands and over the centuries has received the title of Celestial Basilica.

So having told the story of this magnificent place, it is important to what we saw. Since the dedication of the Grotto, a city has risen up around the grotto. There is a church entrance built of stone with a large stone bell tower. The front door is a bronze depiction of the events I just told about. There is so much to see inside that it is overwhelming. There is a burial temple dedicated to the virgin and child. There are paintings covering many of the walls dating back hundreds of years. There is an Angevin Nave with a Baroque altar of St Joseph, parts of which date back to the year 800 A.D. There is an altar dedicated to St Francis who visited the shrine in 1216. There is also a side altar with a piece of the true cross in an elaborate reliquary. Around the altar are several relics of saints, more than a few saintly bishops are contained as well. There are many statues of St Michael throughout the shrine.

There are many side altars around the campus of the shrine. Down in the lower part of the cave is a reconciliation chapel carved into stone with a crucifix and paintings on the wall. The reconciliation rooms are wooden with wooden benches and kneelers.

The most striking piece of the whole place is the St Michael Grotto. It is a unique spectacle of its kind, which unfolds before your eyes. The grotto, with its irregular rocky vault celling, has received millions of pilgrims over the centuries, as well as, where many sinners have received forgiveness. Here each visitor feels like the prodigal son who goes back to his father's house, led and protected by Saint Michael.

The interior of this grotto, not consecrated by human hands gives witness to its centuries-old history by its various elements. This grotto is in the interior of a cave so you can see the natural rock formations of the cave with the simple altar made of stone, the one St Michael erected, and stone carved railings around it with a statue of St Michael behind the altar. There are statues of St Sebastian, a bas-relief of the Most Holy Trinity and a depiction of the Blessed Mother. There is also a bishop's throne carved out of rock. There is a bronze ambo with images of the Gospel writers. The candelabra are bronze made to look like branches or vines. The crucifix is an icon style painting as done in the Eastern Orthodox tradition.

There was truly so much to see here that we missed a few places. I only found this out afterwards because I had purchased a book that is a guide to the shrine and saw a few things I did not see while reviewing the book. Overall this was a wonderful and holy place to visit.

Afterward, we traveled to Rome for dinner and overnight accommodations at our hotel.
