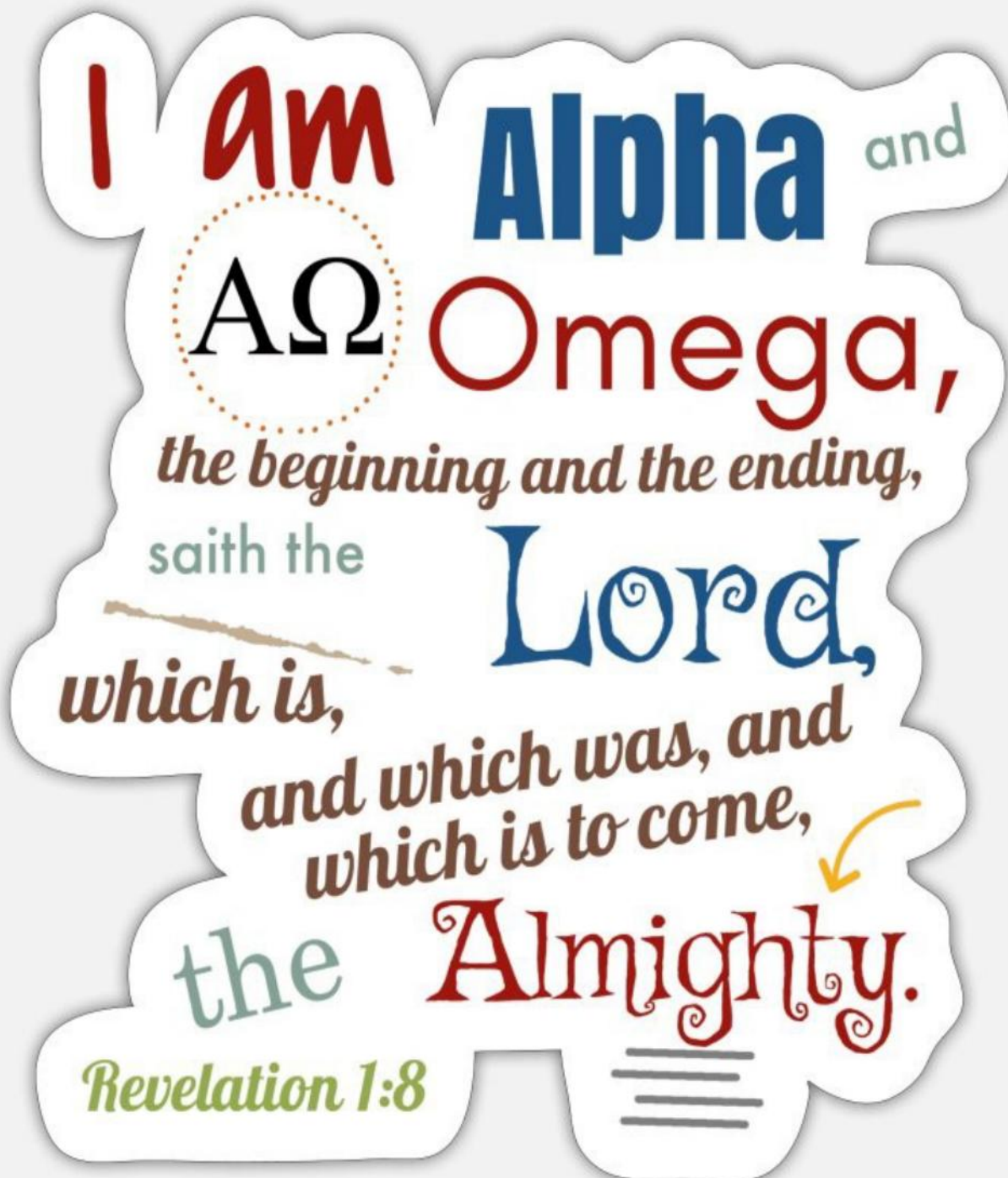

## WHO WINS IN THE END?

Happy Thanksgiving! I would like to start by asking you to read today's Gospel from Luke 21:20-28. If you are a regular Bible reader, this might be a passage that you would like to skip over. Why? Because, after you read it you may say something like, "GULP! Don't blame me, I'm just the messenger."

If you read it very carefully, you might say to yourself, "Boy, this sounds familiar." And it is. Perhaps you have noticed that Mother Nature is raising havoc all over the world. Perhaps more than any other time in our lives. During Jesus' time on earth there were famines and wars. Fast forward to today and guess what? There are still famines and wars. There's also a lot of darkness going on in the area of trying to change oneself into another gender and the enormous amount of babies that are dying in the womb.

The Scripture passage above is full of gloom and doom, but did you know that if something big is coming the Lord will let his people know? For example, before the destruction of Jerusalem in the year 70, God let his people know so the Christians could evacuate before it happened.

## THIS WEEK I WILL PRESENT ONE MORE TYPE OF PRAYER

### SPONTANEOUS PRAYER



#### *PASTOR'S CORNER*

Spontaneous prayer is a form of prayer where you feel moved by the love of God to pray as the Holy Spirit leads you, or spontaneously. You could call it off the cuff prayer as well, but that does not have a very nice ring to it. Many of those in the Charismatic movement love spontaneous prayer. Whenever I am reminded about God's love, I just pray a quick prayer of thanksgiving or I pray for others. I use this form of prayer all of the time at meetings where I am called upon to lead the prayer. Our Protestant brothers and sisters who are ministers are very versed in this form of prayer.

This form of prayer is simple. In it you would thank God for the gifts that He has given you, or you praise Him for being beautifully made. You could thank God for the good things that happen to you each day.

What is important to understand here is that you are allowing the Holy Spirit to guide you in prayer.

Here you can use the prayer of thanksgiving prayer form that I laid out previously to do this.

This prayer form is simple to do if you realize that there is a format to it. First you acknowledge the Presence of God or Jesus. Next you either thank Him for gifts you have been given or you would ask Him for the things that you need. After that you would allow the Holy Spirit to inspire you with things to say.

Here are a few samples:

Almighty Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, I give you thanks today for the gift of life. You created me and you have brought me to this place in my life. Please give me strength in trying times. Please help me to see your presence especially when I am struggling. Shower me with Your grace so that I may be an inspiration to others when they see Your presence in my life. Amen

Or if you were touched by something that God showed you like beautiful flowers in the field you could pray like this; of course you could pray this for anything you find that is beautiful.

Thank you Lord for those beautiful flowers growing in the field. What a beautiful sight that they are to behold. Seeing them warmed my heart and really touched me in a special way. You always create such wonderful sights. Each day is a new blessing, I thank You for your love. Amen.

Sometimes you may feel like praying a longer prayer, you could do that as well. Here you could list all of the good things that have happened in your life. I only list a few here.

My Lord and God, thank you for my parents who raised me. Without them I would not be here right now. Thank you for my wife/husband and my children. Thank you for my job that allows me to have a place to live and raise my children. Thank you for having a place to live and food on my table. While sometimes I do complain about my problems, help me to see how many people in our world, especially in other countries do not have these things. While our country is in turmoil and very divided we have so much to be thankful for like the right of life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. But more importantly we have the right to religious freedom. Unfortunately many countries do not have this right. So there is so much that I should be thankful for and I want to take this time to list all that I can and thank you for all that I should Amen.

You could even pray when you are going through tough times in your life.

Oh Lord I am really struggling right now. Help me to see that You are close, especially when my life is so difficult like right now when I am struggling with this depression. Help me to see light on the other side. When it is so hard to see You, send me someone who cares who can be an angel in disguise.

Please show me Your presence, so that I can make it another day. Amen.
