THE SCRIPTURAL ROSARY PART. 1

In last week's Pastor's Corner, I gave the basic outline for praying the rosary. This week I will begin showing some of the beautiful ways that we can use the rosary as a meditation. First, I will begin with introducing the Scriptural Rosary. I will also give excerpts from the Apostolic Letter of Saint John Paul II titled, *Rosarium Virginis Mariae*, and a few short meditations on the rosary that I came across that will help you to get more out of this wonderful devotion.

Some years ago, I served at a funeral where the Scriptural Rosary was prayed before the Mass. Afterwards, a Protestant woman, who attended the funeral, came up to me and said, "Father, now I understand why you Catholics pray the rosary. That was beautiful." Since Protestants are very scripturally minded, she saw the beauty of praying the rosary in this format because so much scripture is presented when you pray the rosary in this way.

Since the Scriptural Rosary is a long form of prayer, I will break it up into four Pastor's Corners. First, I will print out the Joyful Mysteries. Second, will be the Luminous Mysteries. Next, I will give excerpts from St. John Paul II's apostolic letter as a meditation for the first Sunday of November. After that, I will continue with the Sorrowful Mysteries and then the Glorious Mysteries. After this, I will give the short meditations on the rosary in several Pastor's Corners.

Scriptural Rosary According to the Dominican Friars

The Scriptural Rosary begins as usual with the Creed, the Our Father, three Hail Mary's, and the Glory Be. After this, you start with the Scripture reading for the First Mystery and after each Hail Mary you read the passage from Scripture. This form of the Rosary is to help you focus on the Scriptures and it should give you a new look at what a wonderful gift the Rosary is to us Catholics.

FIRST JOYFUL MYSTERY: THE ANNUNCIATION. "THE ANGEL GABRIEL WAS SENT FROM GOD TO A TOWN OF GALILEE CALLED NAZARETH, TO A VIRGIN BETROTHED TO A MAN NAMED JOSEPH, OF THE HOUSE OF DAVID, AND THE VIRGIN'S NAME WAS MARY." LUKE 1:26-27 (OUR FATHER...)

1. Coming to her, he said, "Hail, full of grace! The Lord is with you." Luke 1:28 (Hail Mary ...)
2. But she was greatly troubled at what was said and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. Luke 1:29 (Hail Mary ...)
3. "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God." Luke 1:30 (Hail Mary ...)
4. "Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called son of the Most High." Luke 1:31 (Hail Mary ...)
5. "How can this be, since I do not know man?" And the angel said to her in reply, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. Therefore the child to be born will be called holy, the Son of God." Luke 1:34-35 (Hail Mary ...)
6. All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: "Behold, the virgin shall be with child and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel," which means "God is with us." Matthew 1:22-23 (Hail Mary ...)
7. "And behold, Elizabeth, your relative, has also conceived a son in her old age... for nothing will be impossible for God." Luke 1:36-37 (Hail Mary ...)
8. Mary said, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word." Luke 1:38 (Hail Mary ...)
9. In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God... and the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us, and we saw his glory, the glory as of the Father's only Son, full of grace and truth. John 1:1, 14 (Hail Mary ...)
10. The Angel of the Lord appeared to [Joseph] in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home. For it is through the Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her. She will bear a son and you are to name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." Matthew 1:20b-21 (Hail Mary ... Glory Be ...)

SECOND JOYFUL MYSTERY: THE VISITATION. "MARY SET OUT AND TRAVELED TO THE HILL COUNTRY IN HASTE TO A TOWN OF JUDAH, WHERE SHE ENTERED THE HOUSE OF ZECHARIAH AND GREETED ELIZABETH." LUKE 1:39-40 (OUR FATHER ...)

1. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the infant leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth, filled with the Holy Spirit, cried out in a loud voice. Luke 1:41-42 (Hail Mary ...)
2. "Most blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And how does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me?" Luke 1:42-43 (Hail Mary ...)
3. "For at the moment the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the infant in my womb leaped for joy. Blessed are you who have believed what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled." Luke 1:44-45 (Hail Mary ...)
4. Mary said: "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my savior. For he has looked upon his handmaid's lowliness." Luke 1:46-48a (Hail Mary ...)
5. "Behold, from now on will all ages call me Blessed. The Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is His name." Luke 1:48B-49 (Hail Mary ...)
6. "His mercy is from age to age to those who fear him." Luke 1:50 (Hail Mary ...)
7. "He has shown might with his arm, dispersed the arrogant of mind and heart. He has thrown down the rulers from their thrones but lifted up the lowly." Luke 1:51-52 (Hail Mary ...)
8. "The hungry he has filled with good things; the rich he has sent away empty." Luke 1:53 (Hail Mary ...)
9. "He has helped Israel his servant, remembering his mercy, according to his promise to our fathers, to Abraham and to his descendants forever." Luke 1:54-55 (Hail Mary ...)

10. Mary remained with her about three months and then returned to her home. Luke 1:56 (Hail Mary ... Glory Be ...)

Third Joyful Mystery: The Birth of Jesus. "Now this is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about. When his mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found with child through the holy Spirit." Matthew 1:18 (our father...)

1. But you, Bethlehem-Ephrathah/ least among the clans of Judah,/ From you shall come forth for me/ one who is to be ruler in Israel;/ Whose origin is from of old,/ from ancient times./ Therefore the Lord will give them up, until the time/ when she who is to give birth has borne/... He shall take his place as shepherd." Micah 5:1-2a, 3a (Hail Mary ...)

2. In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that the whole world should be enrolled... Joseph too went up from Galilee from the town of Nazareth to Judea, to the city of David that is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and family of David, to be enrolled with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. Luke 2:1, 4-5 (Hail Mary ...)

3. When the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to ransom those under the law, so that we might receive adoption. Galatians 4:4 (Hail Mary ...)

4. The time came for her to have her child, and she gave birth to her firstborn son. She wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn. Luke 2:6b-7 (Hail Mary ...)

5. There were shepherds in that region living in the fields and keeping the night watch over their flock. The angel of the Lord appeared to them... and said "Do not be afraid; for behold, I proclaim to you good news of great joy that will be for all people. For today in the city of David a savior has been born for you who is Messiah and Lord." Luke 2:8-11 (Hail Mary ...)

6. Suddenly there was a multitude of the heavenly host with the angel, praising God and saying: "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests." Luke 2:13-14 (Hail Mary ...)

7. When the angels went away from them to heaven, the shepherds...went in haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the infant lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known the message that had been told them about this child... And Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart. Luke 2:15a, 16-17, 19 (Hail Mary ...)

8. When Jesus was born...behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." When king Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Matthew 2:1-3 (Hail Mary ...)

9. After their audience with the king they set out. And behold, the star they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was... On entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. Luke 2:9-11a (Hail Mary ...)

10. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way. Luke 2:11b-12 (Hail Mary ... Glory Be ...)

FOURTH JOYFUL MYSTERY: PRESENTATION IN THE TEMPLE. "WHEN THE DAYS WERE COMPLETED FOR THEIR PURIFICATION...THEY BROUGHT HIM UP TO JERUSALEM TO PRESENT HIM TO THE LORD." LUKE 2:22 (OUR FATHER ...)

1. "When a woman has a child, giving birth to a boy... when the [forty] days of her purification... are complete, she shall bring to the priest at the door of the meeting tent... two turtle doves or two young pigeons." Leviticus 12:2-8 (Hail Mary ...)

2. It is written in the law of the Lord, "Every male that opens the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord." Luke 2:23 (Hail Mary ...)

3. There was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon...it had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he should not see death before he had seen the Messiah of the Lord. Luke 2:25a, 26 (Hail Mary ...)

4. [Simeon] took [Jesus] into his arms and blessed God, saying: "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word." Luke 2:28-29 (Hail Mary ...)

5. "For my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in sight of all the peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel." Luke 2:30-32 (Hail Mary ...)

6. Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, "Behold this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted." Luke 2:34 (Hail Mary ...)

7. "...and you yourself a sword will pierce) so that the thought of many hearts may be revealed." Luke 2:35 (Hail Mary ...)

8. There was also a prophetess, Anna... a widow...she was eighty-four. She never left the temple, but worshiped night and day with fasting and prayer. Luke 2:36-37 (Hail Mary ...)

9. Coming forward at that very time, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem. Luke 2:38 (Hail Mary ...)

10. Behold, the angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Rise, take the child and his mother, flee to Egypt." ... when Herod realized that he had been deceived by the magi...he ordered the massacre of all the boys in Bethlehem and its vicinity two years old and under. Matthew 2:13 (Hail Mary ... Glory Be ...)

FIFTH JOYFUL MYSTERY: FINDING IN THE TEMPLE. "HIS PARENTS WENT TO JERUSALEM EVERY YEAR AT THE PASSOVER." LUKE 2:41 (OUR FATHER ...)

1. For a child is born to us, a son is given to us/ upon his shoulder dominion rests./ They name him Wonder-Counselor, God-Hero,/ Father-Forever, Prince of Peace./ His dominion is vast/ and forever peaceful,/ Upon David's throne, and over his kingdom." Isaiah 9:5-6 (Hail Mary ...)

2. When Herod had died, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph and said "Rise, take the child and his mother and go to the land of Israel, for those who sought the child's life are dead." Matthew 2:19-20 (Hail Mary ...)

3. You may not offer the Passover sacrifice within any of your towns which the LORD your God gives you, but at the place which the LORD your God will chose, to make his name dwell in it... Three times a year all your males shall appear before the LORD your God at the place which he will choose. Deuteronomy 16:5-6, 16a (Hail Mary ...)

4. When he was twelve years old, they went up [to Jerusalem] according to festival custom. After they had completed its days, as they were returning, the boy Jesus remained behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it, thinking that he was in the caravan. Luke 2:42-44a (Hail Mary ...)

5. They journeyed for a day and looked for him among their relatives and acquaintances, but not finding him, they returned to Jerusalem to look for him. Luke 2:44b-45 (Hail Mary ...)

6. After three days they found him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions, and all who heard him were astounded at his understanding and his answers. Luke 2:46 (Hail Mary ...)

7. His mother said to him, "Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety." Luke 2:48b (Hail Mary ...)

8. He said to them, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" But they did not understand what he said to them. Luke 2:49-50 (Hail Mary ...)

9. He went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them. Luke 2:51a (Hail Mary ...)

10. And his mother kept all these things in her heart. Luke 2:51b (Hail Mary ...)

After the fifth mystery you would pray the Glory Be and this prayer.

Hail, Holy Queen, mother of mercy, our life, our sweetness and our hope! To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve; To thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this valley of tears. Turn then, most gracious advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us, and after this our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus. O clement, o loving, o sweet Virgin Mary!

V. Pray for us, O Holy mother of God.

R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Let us Pray:


O God, whose only begotten Son, by his life, death, and resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life. Grant, we beseech thee, that while meditating upon these mysteries of the most Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain, and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

V. May the Divine Assistance remain always with us.

R. and may the souls of the faithful departed through the mercy of God rest in peace.

V. May the Lord bless us, protect us from all evil, and bring us to everlasting life.

R. Amen.
