



SCRIPTURAL ROSARY PART 2

Today, I present the second part of the Scriptural Rosary with the Luminous Mysteries. These mysteries were given to us by His Holiness Saint John Paul II in his Apostolic Letter, *Rosarium Virginis Mariae*.

You begin the Scriptural Rosary with the Creed, an Our Father, three Hail Mary's, and then pray the Glory Be. After this, you start with the reading from the First Mystery and after each Hail Mary you would read the passage from Scripture. This form of the Rosary is meant to focus you on the Scriptures throughout the Rosary, and it should give you a new look at what a wonderful gift the Rosary is to us Catholics.

FIRST LUMINOUS MYSTERY: THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD. "IN THOSE DAYS CAME JOHN THE BAPTIST, PREACHING IN THE WILDERNESS OF JUDEA, 'REPENT, FOR THE KINGDOM OF HEAVEN IS AT HAND.'" MT. 3:1-2. (OUR FATHER...)

- 1. [John was] he who was spoken of by the prophet Isaiah when he said, "The voice of the one crying in the wilderness: prepare the way of the Lord, make His paths straight." Mt. 3:3. (Hail Mary...)
- 2. [John said:] I baptize you with water for repentance, but he who is coming after me is mightier than I, whose sandals I am not worthy to carry; he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire. Mt. 3:11. (Hail Mary...)
- 3. THE NEXT DAY [JOHN] SAW JESUS COMING TOWARD HIM, AND SAID, "BEHOLD, THE LAMB OF GOD, WHO TAKES AWAY THE SINS OF THE WORLD!" JN. 1:29 (HAIL MARY...)
- 4. Jesus [had come] from Galilee to John at the Jordan, to be baptized by him. John would have prevented him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?" But Jesus answered him, "Let it be so now; for it is proper for us in this way to fulfill all righteousness." Mt. 3:13-15. (Hail Mary...)
- 5. John bore witness to him, and cried, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks before me, for he was before me'...for this I came baptizing with water, that he might be revealed to Israel." Jn. 1:15;31. (Hail Mary...)
- 6. When Jesus had been baptized...suddenly the heavens were opened to him and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. And a voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." Mt. 3:16-17. (Hail Mary...)
- 7. And John bore witness [to Jesus]: "I saw the spirit descend as a dove from heaven and remain on him. I myself did not know him; but he who sent me to baptize with water said to me, 'He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain, this is he who baptizes with the Holy Spirit. And I have seen and have borne witness that this is the Son of God." Jn. 1:32-34. (Hail Mary...)
- 8. And the spirit of the Lord shall rest upon him...and his delight shall be in the fear of the Lord...With righteousness he shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth. Isaiah 11:2-4. (Hail Marv...)
- 9. [The Lord] said to me: "You are my son; today I have begotten you. Ask of me, and I will make the nations your heritage, and the ends of the earth your possession. Psalm 2:7-8. (Hail Mary...)
- 10. Jesus said: "Whoever drinks of the water that I shall give him will never thirst; the water that I shall give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life." Jn. 4:14. (Hail Mary...Glory be...)

SECOND LUMINOUS MYSTERY: THE WEDDING FEAST AT CANA. "THERE WAS A MARRIAGE AT CANA OF GALILEE, AND THE MOTHER OF JESUS WAS THERE; JESUS ALSO WAS INVITED WITH HIS DISCIPLES." JN. 2:1-2 (OUR FATHER...)

- 1. When the wine failed, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "O woman, what have you to do with me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." Jn. 2:3-5. (Hail Mary...)
- 2. Jesus said to the servants, "Fill the [six stone] jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the steward of the feast." Jn. 2:7-8. (Hail Mary...)
- 3. When the steward of the feast tasted the water now become wine...[he] called the bridegroom and said to him, "Every man serves the good wine first, and when men have drunk freely, then the poor wine; but you have kept the good wine until now." Jn. 2:9-11. (Hail Mary...)
- 4. This, the first of his signs, Jesus did at Cana in Galilee, and manifested his glory; and his disciples believed in him. After this he went down to Capernaum, with his mother and his brethren and his disciples; and there they stayed for a few days. Jn. 2:11-12. (Hail Mary...)
- 5. Jesus said: "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. Every branch of mine that bears no fruit, he takes away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes, that it may bear more fruit." Jn 15:1-2. (Hail Mary...)
- 6. "Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me." Jn 15:4. (Hail Mary...)

- 7. "I am the vine, and you are the branches. He who abides in me, and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing." Jn. 15:5. (Hail Mary...)
 - 8. "If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask whatever you will, and it shall be done for you." Jn. 15:7. (Hail Mary...)
- 9. "As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love." Jn. 15:9-10. (Hail Mary...)
- 10. "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. Greater love has no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends." Jn. 15:12-13. (Hail mary...Glory be...)

THIRD LUMINOUS MYSTERY: THE PREACHING OF THE KINGDOM OF GOD "SEEING THE CROWDS, [JESUS] WENT UP ON THE MOUNTAIN, AND WHEN HE SAT DOWN HIS DISCIPLES CAME TO HIM. AND HE OPENED HIS MOUTH AND TAUGHT THEM." MT. 5:1-2. (OUR FATHER...)

- 1. Jesus said: "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted." Mt. 5:3-4. (Hail Mary...)
- 2. "Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth. Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied." Mt. 5:5-6. (Hail Mary...)
 - 3. "Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy. Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God." Mt. 5:7-8. (Hail Mary...)
- 4. "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God. Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." Mt. 5:9-10. (Hail Mary...)
- 5. "Blessed are you when men revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven." Mt. 5:11-12. (Hail Mary...)
- 6. "Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be sons of your Father who is in heaven; for he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and the unjust. For if you love those who love you, what reward have you?" Mt. 5:44-48. (Hail Mary...)
- 7. When you fast, and pray, and give alms, do so in secret that it may "not be seen by men but by your father who is in secret; and your father who sees in secret will reward you." Mt. 6:18. (Hail Mary...)
- 8. "Do not be anxious about your life, what you shall eat or what you shall drink, nor about your body, what you shall put on. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? Which of you, by being anxious, can add one cubit to his span of life?" Mt. 6:25-27. (Hail Mary...)
- 9. "Ask, and it will be given you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives, and he who seeks finds, and to him who knocks it will be opened." Mt. 7:7-8. (Hail Mary...)
- 10. "Judge not, that you be not judged. For with the judgment you pronounce you will be judged, and the measure you give will be the measure you get. Why do you see the speck that is in your brother's eye, but do not notice the log that is in your own eye?" Mt. 7:1-3. (Hail Mary...Glory Be...)

WITH YOU BEFORE I SUFFER; FOR I TELL YOU I SHALL NOT EAT IT UNTIL IT IS FULFILLED IN THE KINGDOM OF GOD.'" LK. 22:14 -16. (OUR FATHER...)

- 1. And he took bread, and when he had given thanks he broke it and gave it to them, saying, "This is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." Lk. 22:19. (Hail Mary...)
- 2. And likewise [he took] the chalice after supper, saying, "This chalice which is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood. But behold the hand of him who betrays me is with me on the table." Lk. 22:20-22. (Hail Mary...)
- 3. Jesus said to the crowd: "Do not labor for the food which perishes, but for the food which endures to eternal life, which the Son of man will give to you." Jn. 6:27. (Hail Mary...)
 - 4. "I am the bread of life; he who comes to me shall not hunger, and he who believes in me shall never thirst." Jn. 6:35. (Hail Mary...)
- 5. "Your fathers ate manna in the wilderness, and they died. This is the bread which comes down from heaven, that a man may eat of it and never die." Jn. 6:49-50. (Hail Mary...)
- 6. "I am the living bread which came down from heaven; if anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever; and the bread which I shall give for the life of the world is my flesh." Jn. 6:51. (Hail Mary...)
- 7. "Truly, truly I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day." Jn. 6:52-54. (Hail Mary...)

- 8. "For my flesh is food indeed, and my blood is drink indeed. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him." Jn. 6: 55-56. (Hail Mary...)
- 9. Jesus went in to stay with the disciples when they had reached Emmaus, but their eyes were kept from recognizing him. when he was at table with them, he took the bread and blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. and their eyes were opened and they recognized him. Luke 24:16;30. (Hail Mary...)
- 10. After the day of Pentecost, all who believed were together and had all things in common...and day by day attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they partook of food with glad and generous hearts...and the Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved. Acts 2:1;44;46-47. (Hail Mary...Glory Be...)


After the fifth mystery you pray the Hail Holy Queen:

Hail, Holy Queen, Mother of mercy, our life, our sweetness and our hope! To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve; to thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this valley of tears. Turn then, most gracious advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us, and after this our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus. O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary!

- V. Pray for us, O Queen of the Most Holy Rosary.
- R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Let us pray,

- O God, whose only begotten Son, by his life death and resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal salvation, grant, we beseech thee, that while meditating upon these mysteries of the Most Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
 - V. May the divine assistance remain always with us.
 - R. And may the souls of the faithful departed through the mercy of God rest in peace. Amen
 - V. May the Lord bless us, protect us from all evil, and bring us to everlasting life.





TO BOAST OR NOT TO BOAST

The Gospel makes it pretty clear that exalting yourself is not the way into the Kingdom. So it might sound strange to hear Paul saying he competed well and finished the race and now expects the winner's crown. So why is he any different from the Pharisee in the Gospel?

The Pharisee probably was being honest about himself. Sure, he fasts and tithes, is not greedy or adulterous, but he misses the point. He thinks that justification, being right with God, comes from a person's accomplishments. He feels no need to ask for God's mercy. Yet if he relied on that mercy, he wouldn't boast about his good deeds. Instead, he would ask for God's mercy and then thank God by doing good or being generous. In other words, he put the cart before the horse. He thinks that God is waiting to be bribed with good deeds (or at least a lack of bad ones) so that he can be justified. "After all," thinks the Pharisee, "what else are good deeds for if not to make me look good?"

St. Paul, on the other hand, looks at his life as a Pharisee and is amazed that God forgave his "good works" of keeping the law and persecuting Christians. He is so grateful for God's mercy that he can't wait to tell everyone about Jesus and how he loves us. His boasting is not about what he has done for God; it's more about what God has done through him. In verse 17, he credits God, who gave him the strength to preach the Good News.

Maybe you have examples of what God has done in your life: the people God sent to love you, the talents or abilities God gave you, the times God forgave your sins. Are you so grateful for what God has done that you want to do more for God? Or do you go to church, put your offering in the collection, and work a booth at the parish picnic so that God will be grateful to you? It sounds obvious when put that way, but it is tempting to think that God loves us more when we do good things. Remember that God loved St. Paul while he was still persecuting Christians, loved him enough not only to forgive him but to make him into a great apostle. Why waste your time trying to earn that love, when you could be doing whatever you can to thank God for it?


