Here is a recommended summer reading list for **students entering second grade**. While there is no required book report, we hope your child will practice reading books over the summer. Please have them keep the required Reading Log (attached) for the books they read for both July and August. Also, if your child is a strong reader, we hope that you will continue reading books together. This provides a special bonding time and a model for reading with expression and fluency.

We encourage children to read books from all genres, such as, fiction, non-fiction, chapter books, poetry and folktales. Enjoy! **The children are required to read a biography and poetry.**

*\*The required summer Reading Log is due the first week of school. It is our first reading grade.*

*\*\*Please have your child continue practicing basic math facts (single and double digit addition and subtraction) to increase fluency.*

*\*\*\* Any work not completed in any of your first grade books; it is suggested to continue working in them for reinforcement of skills and concepts.*

**Information for Parents**

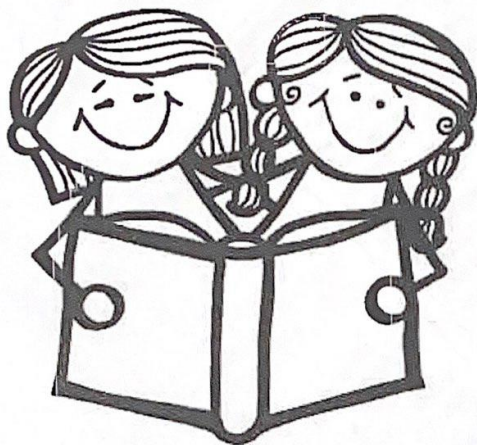
Five Finger Rule for Choosing a Book

Ask your child to read a random page. Count the number of times your child stumbles over or misses a word without self-correction. If you count more than five misses on a page, that book may be too difficult or your child may need adult assistance with the book.

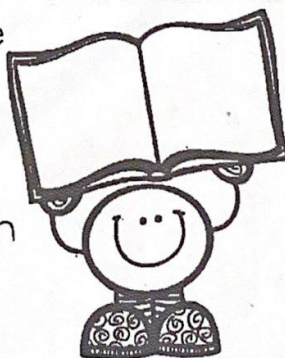
# Reading At Home...

## Can Make A HUGE Difference!



### Choose Books That Are At An Appropriate Reading Level For Your Child

- ☐ Use the five finger rule. Open the book to any page and ask your child to read. Put up a finger every time your child does not know a word. If you have put up more than five fingers before the end of the page, this book is too hard for your child.
- ☐ Choose books that match your child's likes and interests.



### Make Reading A Part Of Your Family Time!

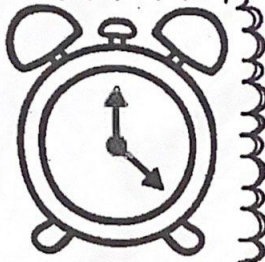
Family time is so important... Why not make reading part of this valuable time with your kids? Here are some tips for integrating reading into our daily family activities:

Keep plenty of reading materials in your home: books, magazines, newspapers, and comic books. Children enjoy having a variety of reading materials!

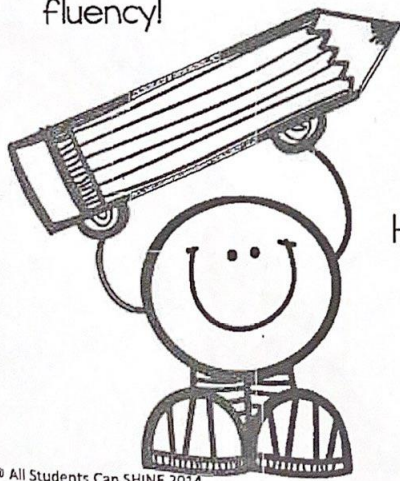

### How To Read With A Beginning Reader:

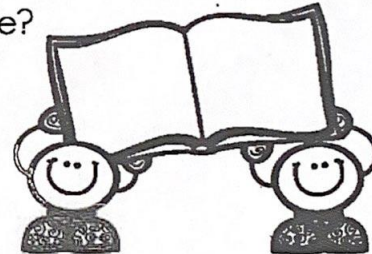
- Encourage your child to use his/her finger to point to each word.
- Read a sentence and have your child repeat it.
- Take turns reading a sentence each or a page each.
- Talk about the story as you read it. What do you think will happen next? What does this story remind you of? How do you think this character feels?
- Don't be afraid to read the same book again! Repeated reading helps build reading fluency!

### Check For Understanding

- ✓ Start the book by making predictions. What do you think will happen in this story?
- ✓ Ask questions and make comments during the reading process.
- ✓ After reading a book, have your child tell you the events from the story in the correct order.
- ✓ What was the problem in this story?
- ✓ How did the character feel when...?
- ✓ Encourage your child to make connections. Does this story remind you of another book you read, an event in your life, a movie?

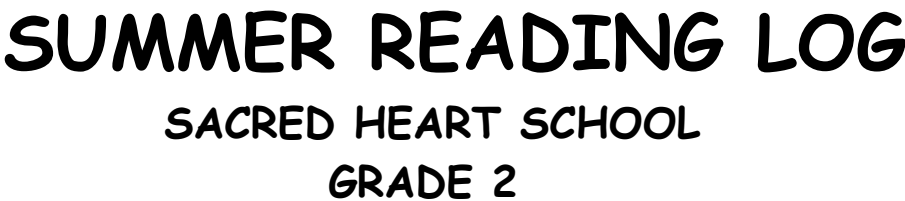
