




A reading from the Book of Prophet Zephaniah

Even tax collectors came to be baptized and they said to him, "Teacher, what should we do?" He answered them, "Stop collecting more than what is prescribed." Soldiers also asked him, "And what is it that we should do?" He told them, "Do not practice extortion, do not falsely accuse anyone, and be satisfied with your wages."

Now the people were filled with expectation, and all were asking in their hearts whether John might be the Christ. John answered them all, saying, "I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fan is in his hand to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire." Exhorting them in many other ways, he preached good news to the people.


Our Family Prayer

Mother Henriette Delille, pray for us that we may be a holy family.


Presentation of Gifts: Come Thou Long Expected Jesus

 We await for the coming savior, Prince of Peace, Emmanuel sent to us from our heavenly Father, here on earth our Lord shall dwell.











The **2022** Mass Intention book is open. There are forms located in the church and you can access them on the church web-



Monthly Explanation of the Mass

The Real Presence and Reception of the Eucharist

Our God is a God who is faithful to His promises! He has promised to be with us always, and as Christians, we know that we need Christ to be present in our lives. He is our very sustenance as he reminded us: unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you (John 6:53).

The truth of Christ' Real Presence in the Eucharist is precisely what the priest is proclaiming at Mass as he raises the consecrated bread and wine saying, "Behold the Lamb of God, behold Him..." Jesus Christ is truly present - Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity - under the forms of bread and wine. It is not ordinary bread and ordinary drink that we receive in the Eucharist, but the flesh and blood of Christ, who came to nourish and transform us, to restore our relationship to God and to one another.

During Holy Communion, the minister raises the host for each person and professes faith in the Real Presence saying, "Body of Christ;" we bow our head in reverence to Christ and respond in faith: Amen. Our Amen has a twofold meaning: 1) it is our assent of faith in Christ's real presence in the Eucharist; and 2) it is our promise to become more like Christ and allow Him to live in us more fully in our daily lives.

Saint John Paul II reminds us that in our reception of the Eucharist, not only do we receive Christ in His fullness, but He also receives each of us, for we become a part of Him. Authentic communion with Christ, therefore, can never be private – we cannot have true communion with Christ without also desiring communion with all of our sisters and brothers.
