

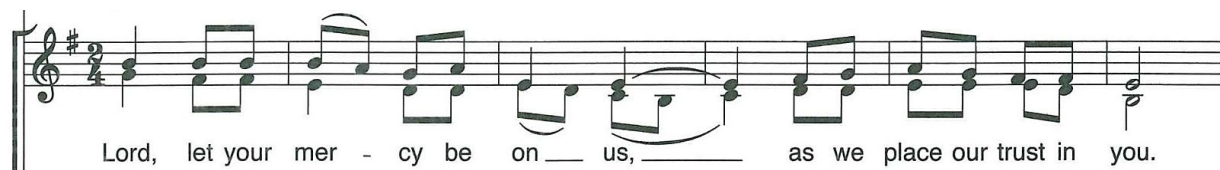
First Reading

A reading from the Book of the Acts of the Apostles

Acts 6:1-7

As the number of disciples continued to grow, the Hellenists complained against the Hebrews because their widows were being neglected in the daily distribution. So the Twelve called together the community of the disciples and said, "It is not right for us to neglect the word of God to serve at table. Brothers, select from among you seven reputable men, filled with the Spirit and wisdom, whom we shall appoint to this task, whereas we shall devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word." The proposal was acceptable to the whole community, so they chose Stephen, a man filled with faith and the Holy Spirit, also Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicholas of Antioch, a convert to Judaism. They presented these men to the apostles who prayed and laid hands on them. The word of God continued to spread, and the number of the disciples in Jerusalem increased greatly; even a large group of priests were becoming obedient to the faith.

Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever believes in me will do the works that I do, and will do greater ones than these, because I am going to the Father."



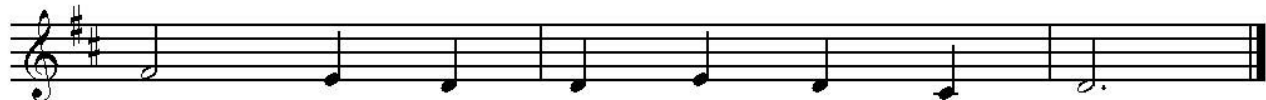

Discontinuing 12:30 pm Mass on Sundays

After much consideration and consultation, I have decided to discontinue the 12:30 pm Mass on Sundays. This will take effect in May. The last Sunday 12:30 Mass will be May 21.

There are several reasons why I have arrived at this decision. First, the attendance at each of our five weekend Masses very rarely goes beyond 250-300 people which is less than 50% of our church's seating capacity. This means that our community is unnecessarily segmented over five Masses. Eliminating one Mass would mean our community would come together more to celebrate Mass over four Masses. The 12:30 pm Mass has the least regular attendance. Secondly, it is difficult to consistently have enough ministers (Lectors, Communion Ministers) for the 12:30 pm Mass. Thirdly, while St. Pius X will have two resident priests for the next year, this will not likely continue in the future. Fewer weekend Masses will make it more manageable for one priest to serve the community.

I realize that this will be an inconvenience for some and I apologize for that. However, I do believe this is the best for the community moving forward. Thank you for your consideration.
