



A reading from the Book of the Prophet Daniel

Dn 7:9-10, 13-14

As I watched: Thrones were set up and the Ancient One took his throne. As they were coming down from the mountain, Jesus charged them, "Do not tell the vision to anyone until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead."


and by the Holy Spirit was Incarnate of the Virgin Mary and became man.


Multi-Purpose Room Cleanout

A Letter from our Pastor

Dear parishioners,

I wanted to point out to you a couple of minor changes to the weekly schedule in the church.

For many years, St. Pius X has offered a weekly parish holy hour, when the parish could come together to worship and adore Our Lord Jesus Christ, who is present for us in the Eucharist. During this time, the sacrament of reconciliation has also ben offered so that all could come to receive the loving mercy of Christ who washes away our sins. As you will probably remember, the Holy Hour used to be held on Wednesday evenings. However, last year Fr. Pat changed his day off to Wednesday and shifted the Holy Hour to Tuesdays. Beginning this week, we have now returned the Holy Hour to Wednesday evenings. This fits better with the schedule of the adoration chapel, which closes early every Wednesday so that we can avoid the problem of having adoration of the Blessed Sacrament happening at the same time in both the church and the chapel. I invite you to join us often at 6:00pm on Wednesday evenings to spend time in quiet prayer with our Lord and to receive the gift of His mercy in Reconciliation.

We will also be transferring one of the other times for reconciliation during the week. Back when I was here as parochial vicar, I asked Fr. Pat for permission to offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation before Mass on Monday mornings. That time of Monday morning confessions has remained since then. But now, since I have Mondays for my day off, I will move the morning confession times to Tuesday mornings from 7:15 until 7:45, before the 8:00am daily Mass. This change will be effective this week. I will also consult the Pastoral Council and others in the parish to find more times when we can offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation each week. Again, I encourage you to make frequent use of the Sacrament of Reconciliation so that the Lord's grace and mercy may lift you to greater holiness.


Thanks for your warm welcome to me in my first month as pastor. I continue to pray that our parish may become more and more a channel of God's grace and mercy and love for all in our community.
