PENTECOST SUNDAY

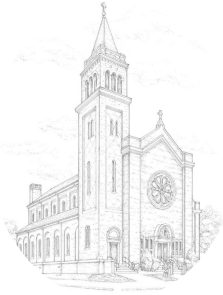
