



Our Sharing First Program will be donated to the "Little Bottoms Catholic Charities Diaper Program". Maydee Morales, Director of Area Offices at CC has informed us of the need to build up their supply of diapers and wipes as they distribute 60,000 diapers to poor and low income families throughout Worcester County each year!

Some information to consider as you ponder the need and your generosity: 5.2 million children under 3 years living in poverty in US; State

benefits such as WIC and SNAP do not pay for diapers; parents must provide diapers for day care providers as state law requires babies be in disposable diapers; typical monthly cost for disposable diapers is \$70-80 per child

Catholic Charities, partnership with Catholic Charities USA and Jet.com is able to purchase diapers at greatly discounted rates in (\$16.24 per 116 vs \$42.13 at Wal-Mart. As you can see our donation will help to keep this very necessary and worthwhile program going especially as the need is growing! Thank you for your loving generosity and care."
