

As we grow up, we all have those learning moments when things

don't go so well or we experience a disappointment or rejection that brings us to tears—and usually to some adult for comfort. Is there a person alive in America who in these moments has not heard, "It's not the end of the world"? In movies, books and our own imagination, we've seen the end of the world a million times. But when does the world really end?

Jesus talks about the end of the world in the Gospels. He knows the Apostles are concerned about it, but He tells them that only the Father knows the day and the hour. In Luke, He describes a scene of great struggle and chaos, events that have occurred time and again in the history of the world. There are TV evangelists who use the Book of Revelation mistakenly to describe something that is to take place soon.

The end of the world is not an event that takes place in history. It is the fulfillment of time when all that we have done is brought to perfection and lifted up to God as our offering to Him. Eternal life begins now, so we are not living in fear of it, but in preparation for it. We need to remain steadfast and confident. God will not abandon us; He will perfect us. All creation will be renewed and restored through Him and with Him and in Him. As the angel says, "Fear not!" God knows what He is doing.


Do you know anyone who is unable to get to Mass in the winter months and might appreciate a home visit with Holy Communion?
