
#### RAPTISM OF THE LORD

### In Word & Deed

n one parish, after adults were baptized during the Easter Vigil, the pastor would announce what each of the newly Baptized would do for the parish.

It might be visiting the sick, or tutoring in the school, or helping deliver meals to the elderly and shut-ins. It made very clear the Baptismal call to service and renewed the parish's commitment to practice what they believed.
