#### SAINT LUKE THE EVANGELIST CHURCH



John's gospel is my favorite. There are many elements and details I love about this gospel. The various images and symbols the evangelist uses to present Jesus stir up our imagina-

tion and invite us to look beyond. One of those elements is the constant tension and increasing animosity between Jesus and the leaders of Israel (sometimes called "The Jews.")

Indeed, Jesus' ministry was a source of preoccupation for the status quo of many people in Israel. The proclamation of the Kingdom of God turned upside down the intentions of many. However, the more Jesus' foes pressed on him, the greater the signs he performed.

Up to now, we have listened to two different encounters of Jesus with some characters: the Samaritan woman and the man born blind. Those episodes serve the purpose of revealing Jesus as the Son of God, the Messiah. This fifth Sunday of Lent, we listen to the last passage in the gospel of John before Holy Week: the resurrection of Lazarus.

The context of this passage is the increasing tension between Jesus and the authorities. They are closely watching Jesus to get something to accuse him. Not only them, the people in general are desperate to hear from Jesus if he is or not the Messiah. Despite the signs he already had performed, many people are still waiting for a confirmation of their hopes for the greatest leader of Israel, the Messiah of God.

And then Jesus receives news of the death of his beloved friend Lazarus. As he shows up at his friends' house, the most dramatic sign is about to happen: Jesus brings his friend Lazarus back from death.

There are many questions this passage can bring up to our minds. I am not intended to answer them. I want to point out the element I mention already, the greater the difficulty, the greater the sign. In previous passages Jesus dealt with the rejected, the sick, the blind, the condemned ones. Now Jesus shows his power over the greatest fear and source of stress of every human being: death.

I like to see in this gospel a challenge to my unbelief. Life can be hard and raw, and certain situations turn it upside down. We go losing hope that anything can be better. We are tired of trying and fighting. The smell of failure and frustration is already stinking our life. That is the moment we should invite Jesus to our house as Martha and Mary did. He probably will take his time to show up, as he did in the gospel.

We must trust. Our beloved friend Jesus is there for us. He knows how to bring us back to life. It might be unclear, but the power of God surpasses all human understanding. It is the time to do the big step of faith and to let Jesus come into our tombs and untie the bands of death that prevent us from going on.

Let us take advantage of this last week of Lent to put all those situations and people who need the loving intervention of Jesus to turn what is dead into life.





















In the movie, Karate Kid, Daniel practices different movements FED through activities that are totally unrelated to karate. 'Wax on, wax

off' and other chores serve to teach him basic moves. His instructor shows him how to put it all together and that one moment is the insight he needs to understand what he has already learned.

The Lenten readings form a catechism that teaches the lessons of the spiritual life. Our struggle with temptation (1st Sunday of Lent) opens us to God's transforming grace (2nd Sunday). Strengthened and renewed by grace (3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday), our blindness is lifted and we see God's will more clearly and proclaim our faith in Jesus (4<sup>th</sup> Sunday). This pattern of spirituality defines our life of faith. We struggle with temptation and are changed by the grace we receive. Our experience of God renews us and we seek greater clarity in our understanding and love of Him.

These lessons all prepare us for the greatest and final lesson. Filled with God's Spirit, the very life and breath of God, we are given new and eternal life. Like the people of Ezekiel's time, or Lazarus, we are called to life in God, never to be separated from Him. It is this promise of the Lord that gives us hope and strength to seek Him, to find Him and to love Him forever.
