The Flemish artist Marten van Valckenborch was a landscape painter who often portrayed biblical scenes in his paintings of contemporary northern landscapes so that they were more accessible to viewers. Today's painting reflects the gospel parable by using a practice we have seen before called the "multiple setting technique," where we see different parts of the story in the painting at the same time to suggest a sequence of events. This painting is part of a series of pictures (like a calendar) of what was known as *Labors of the Months of the Year* and shows different scenes of laborers (in this case also biblical stories) happening at different times of the year. This happens to, coincidentally, be October and we can see Christ's dramatic parable play out during the fall grape harvest as we see the father sending out his son in the top left section, as well as the tragic fate of the previous messengers in the bottom right corner. The purpose of this series of paintings was to provide a visual meditation on the complex theme of the gospel stories.

By now, I am sure you have noticed that the Music Ministry has been relocated to a new area in the front of the church. There are several reasons for this move. According to the general instructions of the Church, the choir, cantors and all ministers of music, as servants of the Divine Liturgy and at the same time being members of the community at prayer, should be located between the nave (the area in which the congregation is seated) and the sanctuary, in a visible place where the congregation is invited and encouraged to participate as active members of the liturgy, especially in singing. 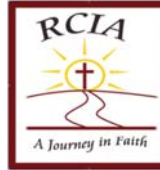

What is the Synod of Synodality

Last Sunday, I briefly mentioned in my homily the Synod of Synodality. I realized that many people don't know about this important meeting. I would like to present some information about it. The word synod comes from two Greek words: "syn" (together, in conjunction) and "hodos" (way) which roughly could be translated as "journeying together."

"The Synod on Synodality is a three-year process of listening and dialogue that began with a solemn opening in Rome on October 9 and 10, 2021 with each individual diocese and church celebrating the following week on October 17. The synodal process will conclude in 2024."

Pope Francis invites the entire Church to reflect on a theme that is decisive for its life and mission: "It is precisely this path of synodality which God expects of the Church of the third millennium." This journey, which follows in the wake of the Church's "renewal" proposed by the Second Vatican Council, is both a gift and a task: by journeying together and reflecting together on the journey that has been made, the Church will be able to learn through Her experience which processes can help Her to live communion, to achieve participation, to open Herself to mission."

Traditionally, a synod is an only-bishops meeting, in which they and some delegates meet to discuss important and specific issues of the universal Church.

Two aspects of this Synod make it special and different from the previous: first, the participation of many diverse delegates (363 in total, 54 of them are women) who will be able to vote. Second, the methodology will be different. Instead of listening to a panel of experts, the participants of the synod will be invited to talk about different challenges of the Church and their speeches will be followed by a moment of reflective silence and prayer.

I would like to invite you to pray that this Synod, by the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, brings new and faithful ways to live out the gospel as a community of believers in this world.

"We stand before You, Holy Spirit, as we gather together in Your name.

With You alone to guide us, make Yourself at home in our hearts;

Teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it. We are weak and sinful; do not let us promote disorder. Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path nor partiality influence our actions.

Let us find in You our unity so that we may journey together to eternal life and not stray from the way of truth and what is right.

All this we ask of You, who are at work in every place and time, in the communion of the Father and the Son, forever and ever." Amen.

Qué es el Sínodo sobre la Sinodalidad?

El Domingo pasado mencioné rápidamente el Sínodo que se celebrará en la Iglesia este mes de octubre. Me he dado cuenta que muchas personas no saben mucho sobre esto, por eso quiero presentarles alguna información sobre éste. La palabra Sínodo viene del griego y está compuesta por dos palabras: "Syn," que significa "juntos" y "odos" que significa "Camino." Podríamos traducir la palabra "Sínodo" como "Caminar juntos."

El Sínodo sobre la Sinodalidad es un proceso de tres años de escucha y diálogo que empezó con una ceremonia de apertura en Roma el 9 y 10 de octubre del 2021 y celebrado en cada diócesis en octubre 17. El proceso sinodal culminará en el 2024.

El Papa Francisco ha invitado a toda la comunidad eclesial a reflexionar en un tema que es decisivo para la vida de la Iglesia y su misión: "Es precisamente este camino de sinodalidad que lo que Dios espera de la Iglesia en el tercer milenio. Este proceso, que sigue el proceso de renovación propuesto por el Concilio Vaticano II, es un regalo y una tarea; caminando y reflexionando juntos en el camino que hemos recorrido, la Iglesia podrá aprender a través de la su experiencia cuáles procesos le pueden ayudar a vivir en comunión, a lograr mayor participación y a abrirse a la misión."

Tradicionalmente, un sínodo es una reunión de obispos solamente, en el cual algunos delegados son invitados a presentar algunos asuntos y retos de la Iglesia universal.

Dos aspectos hacen de este sínodo una reunión especial: primero, la participación de un grupo mas diverso de delegados (363 en total, entre las cuales hay 54 mujeres) que podrán votar. Segundo, la metodología será diferente. En vez de escuchar un panel de expertos, los participantes del sínodo serán invitados a hablar sobre los diferentes retos y sus discursos serán seguidos por un momento de silencio reflexivo y oración.

Quisiera invitarlos a orar por este Sínodo para que, bajo la guía e inspiración del Espíritu Santo, podamos encontrar nuevas y mas fieles maneras de vivir el evangelio como comunidad de creyentes.

Estamos ante ti, Espíritu Santo, reunidos en tu nombre. Tú que eres nuestro verdadero consejero: ven a nosotros, apóyanos, entra en nuestros corazones.

Enséñanos el camino, muéstranos cómo alcanzar la meta. Impide que perdamos el rumbo como personas débiles y pecadoras.

No permitas que la ignorancia nos lleve por falsos caminos. Concédenos el don del discernimiento, para que no dejemos que nuestras acciones se guíen por prejuicios y falsas consideraciones.

Condúcenos a la unidad en ti, para que no nos desviemos del camino de la verdad y la justicia, sino que en nuestro peregrinaje terrenal nos esforcemos por alcanzar la vida eterna. Esto te lo pedimos a ti, que obras en todo tiempo y lugar, en comunión con el Padre y el Hijo por los siglos de los siglos. Amén.
