
FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

"They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh."

Mt. 2:10-11



Today's painting (part of an altarpiece for a chapel in Florence) loosely depicts the event described in today's gospel. Gentile da Fabiano, a Renaissance artist, elaborates upon the story given to us in the gospel. He captures the moment when Christ was revealed to the world, as detailed in the story of the three kings (magi). In the foreground, the oldest king has removed his crown, placed it on the ground, and kneels on all fours to kiss the infant Christ's foot to show reverence. The next eldest of the magi is removing his crown preparing to do the same, while the youngest waits his turn. Their famous gifts are symbols of Christ's identity: the gold represents his kingship, the frankincense represents his divinity, and the myrrh represents his humanity and death, and they are all presented in ornate gold containers. Gentile also depicts a large group of attendants who are following the three magi, most of whom are apparently unaware of what is happening and appear quite distracted. One way to interpret this representation is to imagine the chaotic and distracted state of the world in which our redeemer entered to set our path straight

The Christmas season comes to an end this weekend.

I'll share with you a little bit of history of this celebration.

"Already in 300 AD, the Eastern Church celebrated the Epiphany and the Baptism of Jesus on January 6th. In the Western Church, this feast was mentioned in the Liturgy of the Hours. With the reform of the liturgy in 1969, the date for this Feast was set on the Sunday after the Epiphany. When the Feast of the Epiphany is not celebrated on January 6th, it is celebrated on the Sunday between 2 and 8 January, and the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord is celebrated on the Monday following the Epiphany. The Christmas Season concludes with the celebration of this Feast, even though a "window" is left open until 2 February, when the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple is celebrated. The latter feast is also known as Candlemas since Christ is proclaimed the "light for the Gentiles".

These two last Christmas celebrations (the Epiphany and the Baptism of the Lord) give us the chance to meditate on our discipleship and our spiritual journey, and how we can embrace the gospel in a new and fresh way this year we just began, how can we get involved a little bit more in our community and our Parish, and so to live according to the values of the Kingdom of God.

Finally, Fr. Sagar and I wish you all a wonderful and happy new year, full of blessings, health, and opportunities to grow.

SOLEMNITY OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD



"All of creation is changed by the appearance of Christ."

In popular tradition, the feast of Epiphany commemorates the arrival of the three kings at the stable in Bethlehem where Christ was born. The gospel reading for the day—Matthew 2:1-12 tells the story. Over the years, a lot of tradition has grown around this story. Many people will tell you that the magi were three kings, named Caspar, Balthazar, and Melchior, and they may note that Caspar is traditionally depicted with darker skin. But if you read those twelve short verses from Matthew's Gospel, it becomes clear that we really know very little about the magi. We don't know their names. We don't know where they came from—Matthew only says "from the east." We don't even know that they were kings. The word used by Matthew is "magi," meaning someone learned in esoteric knowledge. Some translations call them "astrologers," but the only basis for that is the statement that they were following a star. And even the star itself is a mystery. Astronomers can chart the movement of the stars back in time, but they can't seem to agree about the existence of an astronomical event that would explain the reference. And even the most casual observer would have a hard time explaining what it would mean for a star to move through the sky and then stop over a particular place. Regardless of who the magi were and how the star showed them the way, the most significant

part of this event is the identity of the one who is made know—Jesus, the newborn king, who is worthy of homage by all men and women. The meaning of the epiphany that occurs in this gospel passage is that the "the newborn king of the Jews" is revealed to and recognized by people from far and distant lands. The appearance of mystical signs in the sky makes the point that all of creation is changed by the appearance of Christ. Because God has chosen to become human, all creation and all the people of the earth can experience the redemption he has come to bring.

The Epiphany of the Lord
"They fell down and worshipped him. They opened their treasures and offered "They fell down and worshipped him. Then Stewardship him gifts of gold, frankincense, and way of LIVING myrrh." (Matthew 2:11) Notice the order of events in the Magi's visit. First, they

knelt before Jesus and prayed to Him. Then they presented Him with their gifts. We, too, must take time to pray before we present our gifts to the Lord. We never know what God may be asking us to share!



People can come into our lives, sometimes for a very short time, and make a big impression. The power of the encounter can

change our life, renew our hope, or strengthen our resolve. It can even set us on a new course, leading us to places, causes and people we never imagined meeting.

The Magi, or astrologers as Matthew calls them, arrive to pay homage to the newborn Jesus. A star had guided them on their quest and when they left, they avoided Herod and went on their way. Their gifts represented the kingship of Christ (gold), His divinity (incense) and his redemptive suffering (myrrh). The story of the Magi reminds us that the whole world has come to recognize and worship a Savior, and the impact of this short visit would reverberate through the ages.

Like the Magi, our life is a journey of faith. We encounter Christ in hundreds of ways. Each momentary encounter has the potential of changing lives, healing wounds, easing suffering and restoring faith. Those we meet along the way are fellow pilgrims who also search for grace and life. Follow the star of faith and offer your gifts of love. Christ will surely lead you.
