Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time September 8, 2024

Again Jesus left the district of Tyre and went by way of Sidon to the Sea of Galilee, into the district of the Decapolis. And people brought to him a deaf man who had a speech impediment and begged him to lay his hand on him. He took him off by himself away from the crowd. He put his finger into the man's ears and, spitting, touched his tongue; then he looked up to heaven and groaned, and said to him, "Ephphatha!"—that is, "Be opened!" Mk 7: 31-34



"Decapolis," where Christ appears in today's gospel, is not a single place, but rather means "Ten Cities" (in Greek) that were on the edge of the Roman Empire, spread between what is today present-day Jordan, Syria and Israel. As such, they were mostly populated by Gentiles (non-Jews). The scene of Christ performing the miracle is highlighted by a light illuminating the area before the large archway and yet is dwarfed by the massive classical Roman architecture that dominates the scene. The painter has chosen to situate today's scene among the architectural ruins of Rome as reminder that Christianity eventually triumphed over the Roman empire. The painting is also a general commentary on Christ's miracle working in that it references several of his other miracles—on the far-left foreground, a man leading a blind woman and a paralytic with a crutch. Also of note, on the right we see a boy in contemporary (17th cen.) dress leading his dog toward the center of the action. This is not only a reminder of the contemporary relevance of Christ's works, but a dog is always a reminder of the faith necessary to recognize Christ.
