And people were bringing children to him that he might touch them, but the disciples rebuked them. When Jesus saw this he became indignant and said to them, "Let the children come to me; do not prevent them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Amen, I say to you, whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it." Mark 10:13-15



This week's painting is by the German artist Fritz von Uhde, whose style expresses aspects of both realism and impressionism situating him uniquely between the two styles. We've seen one of his paintings before on the bulletin (*The Mealtime Prayer*, 1885) – he painted at least four pictures where Christ is shown appearing to contemporary people in the 1800s. Typically, Uhde depicts Christ among the poor; from the laboring working class in cities to rural agrarian communities living off the land. Here, we can understand the economic situation through details such as the poorly woven mat covering the floor, the barefoot boy in line, and the pinned-up cloth for curtains. However, despite the circumstances, the Christian symbolism remains: a barefoot Christ sits on a throne-like chair set upon a type of 'carpet.' These are traditionally motifs of royalty in painting. However, here Christ the King receives a line of mostly children who have nothing and are gathered to see him and receive a blessing. Uhde upends traditional images of royalty here by denying us those typically rich decorative ornamentations by keeping the scene and the materials sparse, making clear the core of Christ's important message from today's gospel.

ST LUKE'S THANKSGIVING PROGRAM – 2024

It has been a long-standing tradition at St Luke's to provide assistance to those in need at Thanksgiving. In the past, we have provided two bags of groceries as well as a grocery card. This year, in order to better meet the needs of our families. Outreach will change things up a bit. Most of the families that come to St Luke's for help receive a monthly SNAP card (formally known as Food Stamps) to get groceries. What many don't realize is that with a SNAP card, you cannot purchase diapers, wipes, detergent, soap, toothpaste, cleaning supplies etc. So, this year we will be asking our kids in the religious ed classes to (instead of food) bring in some of these essential items. Each family will receive a number of these items as well as a \$50. grocery card. Due to inflation, and the increasing number of immigrants who have come to Westboro, the need is greater than ever. More and more families in our community continue to face financial insecurity. It is my hope that we can ease their burden a bit this Thanksgiving. Typically, we provide for about 135 families which means that just the grocery cards alone cost over \$6,000.


- 1.Donating a \$50. grocery card. (The most asked for are Walmart, Stop & Shop and Market Basket.)




Unrealistic idealism is as sure a path to failure as unbridled pessimism. When we expect too much, or expect nothing at all,

we end up in the same place—disappointed. Life is full of twists and turns, ups and downs, successes and failures. It takes a positive attitude, realistic expectations and a lot of love to live life well.

Jesus offers a new teaching on marriage, confronting the accepted traditions. A man could divorce his wife for whatever reason and she had no say. In this male dominated society, a woman had no rights at all. Jesus speaks against divorce not only because the two are one, but also because God is the author of their union. It is a vocation for both the man and the woman and they have equal rights within their marriage.
